1.3 Matters Arising

Minutes 8 July 2022

NEC Funding

- Both NECs to present a 5 year plan to ESNZ.
- Surfaces and yarding had come through as the biggest issues from the survey.

Rider Development Camps

- 5/6 August has been booked for development camp at NINEC.
- Aim to connect these camps with HP.
- Camps to include Show Hunter alongside and utilize off horse activities.
- Aim for Camps to be for Pre-Squad riders - Horses 1.20m and Ponies GP/1.20m
- Discussed that there is a market for riders below this level.
- There could be introductory camps at locations across the country for lower levels that are easier to get to, potentially 2 or 3 in each Island.



2. Strategic Planning Review

2.1 Workplan and Financing

- Board approved moving forward with a printed copy of "Intro to Jumping" booklet.
- Discussed ESNZ developing relationships with Medics, and sharing the names of companies available as many OCs don't know where to start.

2.2 Sponsorship and the future

- Discussion on Series Sponsors and their feedback of their experience
- Discussion on how the Series Points Tables could be improved.
- Prescribed prize money for Age Group Series was a limiting factor for some shows to run these classes. Referred to Tech Comm meeting in April 2023
- Discussed series for lower levels for junior riders and pony riders.
- Discussed Live Streaming services.
- Discussion around a Breeders Award Series - this could be taken from current leaderboards.
- Promote Riders' camps and Star Spotters as sponsorship ideas.

2.3 Review of Show Hunter and Jumping

Maria Collins and Tracey Lammas Joined the Meeting for these discussions.

- Discussed the vision: two tiers - a training ground for young riders and horses, plus also a destination sport.
- Also is a great entry level space for sponsors.
- Show Hunter faces the same problem as other disciplines with Officials. Need to have a recruitment drive for judges and course designers.
- Noted from Jumping's perspective, Show Hunter was part of our sport and would like to have them stay connected to each other.
- Stewarding not yet in place for Show Hunter - consider must have for Series Shows.

Series Finals

- It was agreed that Series Finals for Show Hunter would be at Glistening Waters to keep it connected to Jumping.
- Work is to be done on creating some competition for Show Hunter between HOY and SF.
- It was suggested that Show Hunter prize giving could be done during the day in the ring.
- PX to go to the Show Hunter riders and ask what they would like to happen at SF.

Show Hunter Governing Body

- Discussion around the make-up of the Governing Body of Show Hunter and the current fit for purpose.

Social Media

- Discussion around the need for a separate ESNZ Show Hunter Facebook page.
- Suggested that Show Hunter page be shut down and to merge with ESNZ Jumping and Show Hunter page which already exists.
