Egmont A&P Show General Conditions

Dressage entries close midnight Wednesday 30th October 2024

Show Jumping & Show Hunter entries close midnight Saturday 9th November 2024

All other entries close midnight Saturday 9th November 2024

The following General Conditions are to be read in conjunction with Section Conditions and with the Rules and Bylaws of the Royal Agricultural Society (RAS) of New Zealand.

1) PRIVACY ACT

The A&P Society holds records of names and addresses of all Members, Trade Exhibitors and Competitors and may publish these for the purposes of Show media reports or promotional purposes at the A&P Associations discretion.

The A&P Association may take photographs and video images of Members, Trade Exhibitors, Competitors, exhibits (including livestock) and the employees, agents and assistants of any Trade Exhibitor or Competitor and use this information for reporting or promotional purposes in any media, at the A&P Associations discretion.

2) HEALTH & SAFETY

Competitors must:

- Comply with the appropriate animal legislation and the Health and Safety at Work Act 2015 and any amendments thereafter.
- Supervise and control their animals at all times and shall be liable for any hazards created or accident, illness or damage caused by the action of themselves or their animals at the Showgrounds. The Association reserves the right to order immediate removal from the Showgrounds any animal it considers unruly, dangerous or unmanageable.
- Follow the instructions of Marshals and Officials.
- Ensure that they keep walkways clear, and no dangerous equipment or chemicals are accessible to the public.
- Report accidents to the Show Office.

NO SMOKING or VAPING inside any buildings within the Egmont A & P Showgrounds.

All persons admitted into any premises controlled by the Egmont A&P Association shall be subject to the orders of the Committee and, in the event of misbehavior on the part of anyone attending the Show such person may be removed by order of the Association. This applies to any person whose conduct, either personal or as proprietor of a trade stand, or exhibit, is a source of annoyance.

The Egmont A&P Association will not be responsible for any accident, loss or damage that may be caused directly or indirectly to or suffered by an exhibit.

Persons occupying grandstands, buildings and other structures or other seating accommodation on the Showgrounds do so at their own risk.

The full Health & Safety Policy & Management Plan is available at the Show Office.

2.1) First Aid

First aid stations are located by the Office. Please familiarize yourself with the Showgrounds site map.

2.2) Protective Headgear/Safety Helmets

Wearing a helmet (with a yellow tag) is compulsory for anyone competing on, working in or schooling or riding for any reason a horse within the Showgrounds. Such headgear must be worn with the chinstrap properly adjusted and fastened when in the arena or ring, the practice area, collecting rings or anywhere else within the Showgrounds.

The RAS, Equestrian Sports New Zealand (ESNZ) and NZ Pony Club Association (NZPCA) have a consistent standard in approved safety helmets and use the same yellow safety tags to identify compliant helmets. Some A&P Shows and measuring stands can tag compliant helmets and any yellow tag applied by the ESNZ or NZPCA is accepted by the RAS. All helmets that conform must be identified by the current tag system.

3) RIGHTS OF THE EGMONT A&P ASSOCIATION

The Egmont A&P Association reserves the right to, at any time, for any reason and without notice to:

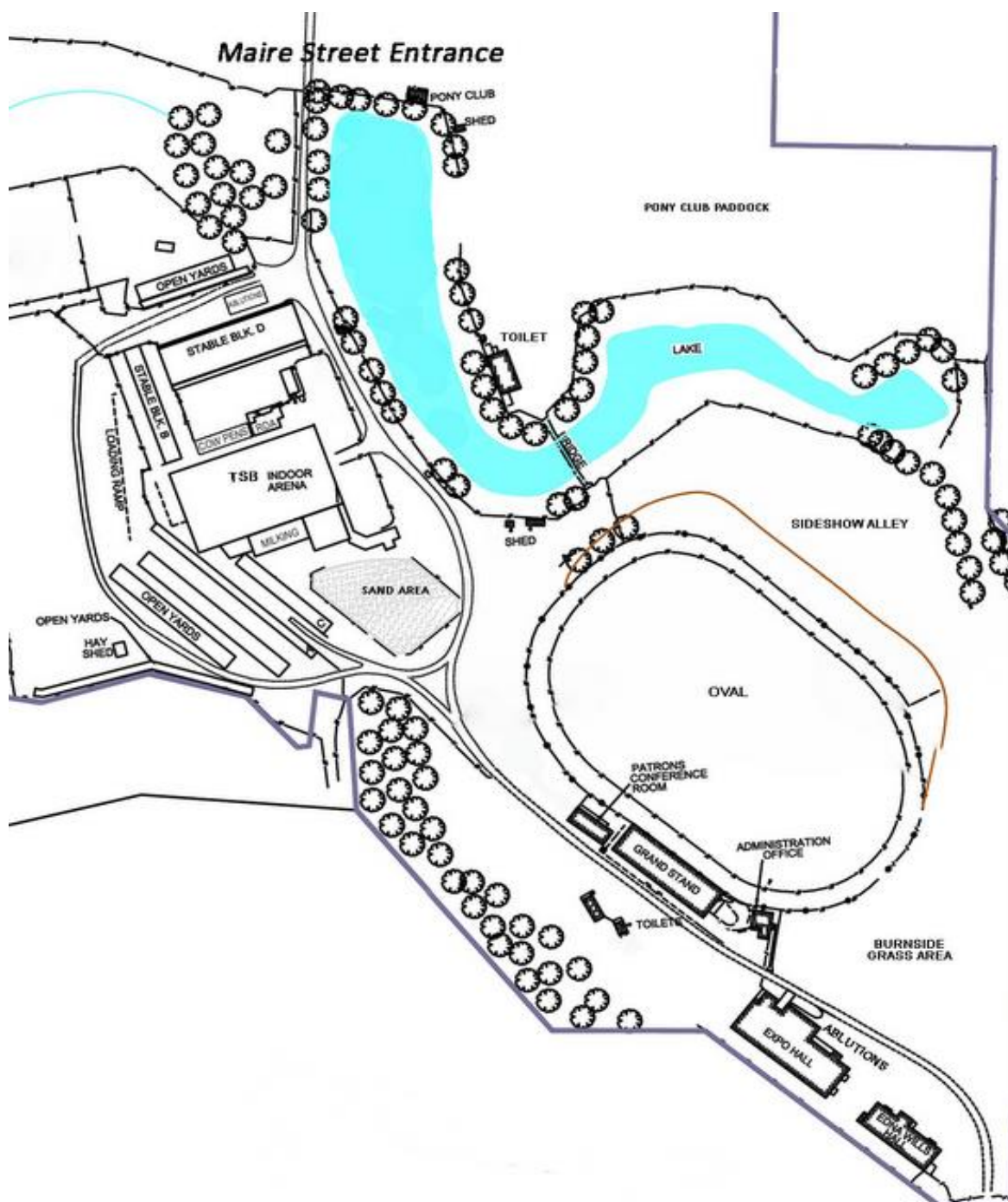
- Refuse or cancel any entry
- Alter the Show timetable
- Withdraw or change any event or class
- Amalgamate classes where there are insufficient entries
- Remove any dangerous or inappropriate exhibit or display

The decision of the Association is final. Competitors will be notified if classes are to be amalgamated.

4) CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- Entries for all Equestrian Sections are to be submitted by entering on Evo Events; www.evoevents.co.nz,
- Entries are not accepted until they are paid in full.
- Entries received after closing date will only be accepted at the discretion of the organisation and will incur a late fee of \$25.00
- There is no receipt of entry unless requested.
- It is the competitor's responsibility to ensure their details of entries are correct.
- Entry in the Show entitles the Egmont A&P Association to publish a competitors' name in results and distribute with Competitor Lists.
- The Association reserves the right to refuse or cancel any entry without adducing any reason for doing so.

5) SCRATCHINGS

- Application for refunds must include a vet certificate or medical certificate.
- 100% refund will be paid until close of entry.
- 50% refund will be paid from close of entry.
- Competitors are encouraged to do their scratching's via My Entries on Evo Events AND notify the Office.

6) PARKING

- ALL equestrian vehicles MUST enter via Maire Street Entrance
- ***Double gates by Norfolk Pine tree are to be kept closed at all times***
- No parking around the horse stalls
- Exit using Maire Street

7) ACCOMMODATION

- Camping fee of \$20.00 per truck or float per night **** There are no powered camping sites available****

-Showers and toilets are provided.

8) STABLING/YARDING

- Stables and yards cannot be guaranteed as they are limited.
- Temporary yards are NOT permitted. This includes taped areas at the truck or float.
- Stallion boxes must have sign denoting "STALLION" on outside of box.

8.1) Stabling/Yarding Bond

- Stabling/ yarding will be issues in order of entry with preference to visitors, organising committee, sponsors, volunteers and those competing at a higher level.
- On arrival all yards and stables will be clean.
- It is the responsibility of the competitor that has been allocated the yard/stable to keep the yard/stable clean and free of rubbish.
- All wet & dirty straw, sawdust etc must be removed from the yard/stable and cleaned out at the conclusion of the Show.
- Competitors are to take photographic evidence prior to departing, please only send these photos in if requested where there is a dispute.
- An Egmont A&P Association Official will be assessing the state yards and stables are left in by the occupying competitor, after the Show. If the yard/stable is not left in satisfactory condition, photographic evidence including yard/stable number will be taken and the competitor will be invoiced \$75.00 and may not have a yard / stable allocated to them in the future.

9) RULES

- ESNZ rules apply to all Dressage and Show Jumping competitors.
- RAS rules apply to all showing, sport and pleasure horse competitors.
- The RAS Judges & Competitors Rulebook (see www.ras.org.nz) sets out all the conditions that apply to the classes and sections offered.
- Should any person or firm be disqualified or suspended by another Association or affiliated organisation of the Royal Agricultural Society, the suspension or disqualification may also be applied by the affiliate organisations.

10) STARTING TIMES

- Starting times are approximate only but the Show will endeavor to adhere to as closely as possible. When a competitor may have two classes they have entered running simultaneously then they must elect which class they compete in. Our judges and stewards will do their best to work in with everyone to the best of their ability.
- To be read in conjunction with the relevant section conditions and rules and By-Laws of the Royal Agricultural Society of New Zealand.

11) LATE ENTRIES & CHANGES DURING THE SHOW

- Late entries will only be accepted at the discretion of the organisation and will incur a late fee of \$25.00
- Competitors can place additional/change entries during the Show for the following day's events. These entries MUST be made at the Horse Office by 5pm the day prior to the competition to allow for alterations of the judging sheets. A 25% surcharge may apply and must be paid at the time the additional entry is made. These riders will go first in the class where it is draw order.
- Substitutions are permitted provided the original equine that is being substituted, takes no further part in this Show. The substitution can only be made into the same class as the original entry and be owned by the same person. Vet certificates are not required. Substitutions MUST be made at the Show Office by 5pm the day prior to the competition to allow for alterations of the judging sheets.

12) PROTESTS

- All protests must be in writing and may be lodged with the Section Chief Steward/Section Head one hour from the completion of the class judged, together with a deposit of \$50 which shall be returned should the protest to upheld. No protest will be received later than one hour after the ribbons are affixed.

13) TROPHIES & CUPS

- All Cups and trophies will be available for awarding and photography purposes ONLY and will be engraved at the Egmont A & P Associations expense.
- No Cups and trophies are to leave the Egmont A&P Showgrounds.

14) PREPARATION FOR DEPARTURE

- Clean out all yards/stables, as you found them – refer to 'Yard/Stabling Bond' pg. 9
- Notify the Office of any damage or repairs and maintenance required.
- Remove all rubbish and personal belongings.
- Check your individual schedules for any specific details related to the section.
- Pay all outstanding fees before departing the Showgrounds.

15) PRIZE MONEY

- Any prize money will be paid into a nominated bank account within 30 days (subject to any queries). Please enter this on Evo Events when entering.
- Bank accounts must be verified before payments will be made.
- Any disputes regarding prize money must be made no later than 30 November.
- The payout scale (excluding Show Hunter and Show Jumping) is as follows:
 - a. In classes with three (3) or less entries, only 1 place will be awarded and paid.
 - b. In classes with four (4) to six (6) entries, 1st and second place will be awarded and paid.
 - c. In classes with seven (7) or more entries, all prize money will be awarded and paid.
- For Show Hunter and non ESNZ series Show Jumping classes, all advertised prize money will be paid out as per jumping rules Art 248.7.
- For Series Classes this show will not pay prize money where riders incur 12 faults or more in the first round.
- Winners will be contacted by the Competitions Team via email to verify their bank account if required.

16) REFUND POLICY

The Committee reserve the right to request a veterinarian or Doctors certificate if any competitor requires a refund. Application for refunds to be in writing within 14 days of the show. 75% of entries fees only will be refunded, no refunds under \$20 will be made except where grading affects the class.

17) BIOSECURITY

The Egmont A&P Society supports all appropriate biosecurity regulations.

18) BEHAVIOUR & CONDUCT – In-Line Resolution Process/ ESNZ Official Warning Card

- This Show supports the RAS In-Line Resolution Process Policy, which will operate in all sections and will be used for any inappropriate behaviour towards Show officials, judges, fellow competitors or any other third party connected with the Show.
- The full working of the policy is available to view on the RAS website www.ras.org.nz

-ESNZ Official Warning Card may be issued, in cases of offences in respect of abuse of animals or inappropriate behaviour as per Dressage NZ, ESNZ Jumping and /or ESNZ Rules and General Regulations Full information on ESNZ Official Warning Card procedure can be found at www.nzequestrian.org.nz.

19) CLEAN SPORT TESTING

- The use of tranquilizers, stimulants or any drugs capable of affecting the performance of horses and ponies is forbidden.
- Competitors are advised that tests for forbidden substances may be carried out during the Show and that testing of animals is at the risk of the person that is responsible. Clean Sport testing will be carried out under the RAS (Incorporated) CleanSport Judicial Committee (CSJC) procedures and rules.
- Any competitor who has administered to their horse or pony any drug during seven days prior to the show is required to notify the secretary and fill out a medication advice form before competing.
- ESNZ Blue Card rules for concussion will apply in both Dressage and Jumping Sections.

20) WHISKER AND INNER EAR TRIMMING FOR HORSES AND PONIES

- As from 1 January 2022 there is to be no trimming of whiskers, eye or inner ear hair/whiskers of horses/ponies competing at RAS affiliated A&P Shows/Events. This is in line with the same animal welfare approach taken by the Equestrian Sport New Zealand (ESNZ) and New Zealand Pony Clubs Association (NZPCA). 21) HEIGHT CERTIFICATES

- The Measuring Rules of the RAS apply to this Show.
- Height certificates and novice status cards must be carried at all times and presented on demand otherwise the competitor will not be allowed to start.
- Competitors in any class where a height certificate is required may not leave the ring to obtain a certificate and will forfeit awards if certificate is not shown. Microchips do not exempt riders from carrying a height certificate.
- Competitors are advised of all measuring days and times which are set prior to entries closing for the Show.
- No measuring will be carried out between the closing of entries and the Show.

22) STALLIONS AND COLTS

- All 'day travelling' stallions and colts must be attended to and supervised at all times by an adult OR placed into a stallion box (to be paid for in entries).
- Stallion boxes must have sign denoting "STALLION" on outside of box.
- All stallions and colts (with the exception of miniature horses and foals) must be shown in a bit and it is compulsory for all stallions and colts to wear (2) official "S" identification badges, one attached to each side of their bridle. The rider and handler must also wear (2) official RAS armbands (one on each arm) when in the ring. Badges can be purchased from RAS Head Office or ESNZ and armbands from RAS Head Office.
- Handlers and Riders must be 17yrs or older and wear an approved Hi-vis vest when outside the showing ring which can be purchased from RAS Head Office.

23) AGE OF RIDERS, HANDLERS, HORSES & PONIES

- Riders and Handlers age eligibility is determined as at the 1 August and stays in that division/section for the complete Show year/season. Proof of age may be required and should be on hand.
- Novice pony stallions must be led or ridden by a rider 14 years & over.
- Open pony stallions must be ridden by a rider 14 - 16 years and led handlers must be 14 years & over.
- Stallions over 148cm must be ridden or led by a rider/handler 17 years & over.
- Horses over 148cm must be ridden by a rider 12 years & over (except for stallions).
- Horses/Ponies under three (3) years of age are not permitted in any ridden or driven (harness) class no matter what the rules of any affiliated Breed Society or Kindred Society may prescribe.

- Horse of the Year Qualifying Show
- All riders, horses and ponies must compete with the appropriate ESNZ membership to compete in ANY Show Hunterclasses.
- Horses and ponies may compete in Show Hunter under the ESNZ casual levy system but if riding on a casual registration will not be awarded any LRHOY qualifying points.
- Run under ESNZ Show Hunter rules & series conditions.
- Riders may enter only one equitation class per day.
- **No Practice rounds**
- Show Hunter Guidelines for Ponies:
 - o Cat A: Ponies 133cm & under 3.05m (10') stride
 - o Cat B: Ponies over 133cm and up to and including 143cm; 3.20m (10'6") stride
 - o Cat C: Ponies over 143cm and up to and including 148cm; 3.35m (11') stride

Conditions of Entry

- Please read these Section Conditions alongside the General Conditions of the Egmont A&P Show.
- These apply to jumping events where applicable, including regulations governing Certificates of Height.
- A horse/pony may only have two starts per day as per ESNZ
- If classes have excess entries the classes will be divided, and prize money adjusted.

Time of Events

- Times stated in the Schedule for Jumping Competitions are approximate only and will be adjusted after entries close according to entries received. The Egmont A&P Show reserves the right to start an event before the catalogued time.
- Overlap - Consideration shall be shown to competitors who are entered in competition that may overlap. Please see the Senior Steward concerned but classes will not be delayed.
- In Ring 1, Competitors must jump in the order as drawn and printed in tile Catalogue. All riders must be suitably attired when entering the ring.

- Ring 1 to be run in strict draw order.
- Ring 2 Blackboard order (Except Series Classes)
- Ring 3 Black board order



ESNZ

- All riders must be ESNZ registered.
- For all classes, (except introductory classes) riders must have a full ESNZ membership, horses must be registered with ESNZ and have a current ESNZ Jumping annual start.
- ESNZ fees will be charged as per ESNZ guidelines on Evo Events.
- Horses are restricted to .90m and under.
- Ponies are restricted to .80m and under.
- Horses and Ponies cannot compete in Series Classes with Casual Start.
- Classes are run under ESNZ Rules and Regulations. For conditions of the series classes please visit www.nzequestrian.org.nz

Egmont Horse Coaches Pony Points Prize

The Egmont Horse Coaches Pony Points Competition is held over the Taranaki Show jumping circuit in selected classes beginning at Waverley A&P, Egmont A&P, Taranaki Equestrian Jumping Spring Spectacular, Stratford A&P and ends at the Taranaki Equestrian Jumping Show in January. Points are allocated 5,3,2,1 at each show and the "John Henry" cup is presented to the leading Taranaki rider at the completion of the series.

Conditions of Entry

- Please read these Section Conditions alongside the General Conditions of the Egmont A&P Show.
- The use of prefixes on horses and ponies in the showing classes be those of the breeder.
- Where classes are defined by height, competitors/exhibitors must carry a current RAS Certificate for their horse/pony at all RAS affiliated Shows/Events, and must produce it upon request to any authorised Show/Event personnel. Any competitor unable to produce such a certificate means that the exhibit is ineligible to compete, and will forfeit any awards.
- If sections coincide no class will be delayed.
- RAS Exhibit Numbers showing classes - It is compulsory to display your exhibit number (exhibitor to provide) while in a RAS judging ring. This can be in a number holder or make your own armband which is worn on left arm.
- The number of Novice wins is to be counted at the time of the Show/Event, not the time of entry. If a Novice entry exceeds the permitted number of wins by the day of the Show/Event, the competitor must advise the Secretary's Office and change to an Open class, or if no class remains to enter, a refund will be actioned after the Show/Event.
- Imported Horse/Pony - Any wins gained overseas by a horse/pony that is imported into New Zealand, count towards their classification when showing in New Zealand, i.e. whether it can still compete in the Novice section (5 wins or less) , or if it has 6 or more wins, then it must compete in the Open section.

RULES:

1. All classes run under ESNZ rules.
2. All tests are from the Dressage NZ test book dated 1/9/2023.
3. All riders in graded classes Novice & Above must have Full ESNZ Membership current to 17/11/24.
4. Riders competing in Introductory Classes & Preliminary must be an ESNZ Introductory Annual Member or Full Membership or pay an ESNZ casual membership.
5. All ESNZ Horse/Pony registrations must be current to 17/11/24.
6. Dressage Flexi-start payable for ESNZ registered horses & ponies with no annual dressage start \$5 per test all Levels 1-4-
7. One ESNZ graded class score will qualify for Dressage Taranaki circuit points.
8. Maximum of three starts per horse.
9. Pony classes 2028/30/32/34 may only be contested by a rider 16 years and under at 1 Aug 2024
10. Pony riders 16 years and under at 1 Aug 2024 contesting any class will be eligible for the Polarlight Trophy for their two highest percentages.
11. Dressage draw will be posted on www.egmontshowgrounds.org.nz and www.evoevents.co.nz
12. All technical dressage queries, please contact show office.
13. Entries received after draw is completed can only be accepted in the place of scratching's.
14. The organising committee reserves the right to alter the program and/or prize money within the ESNZ GR's/Dressage NZ rules or cancel classes if insufficient entries.
15. Intro, Prelim, Novice & Elementary classes may be held in the Oval. Medium, Advanced Medium & Advanced classes will be held in the TSB Indoor Arena.
16. ESNZ horse registration number must be displayed at all times on both sides of the horse or pony during the dressage competition with the exclusion of Non Graded horses and ponies.

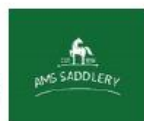

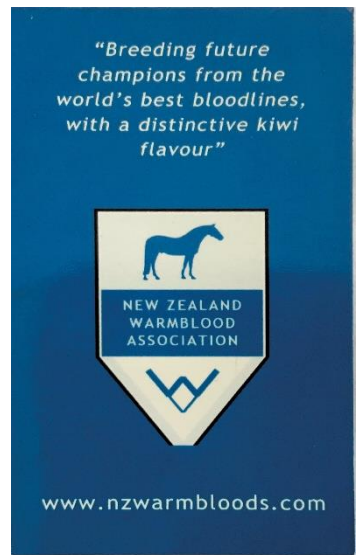

Fred & Eunice Rodie

CHARITABLE TRUST

The Fred and Eunice Rodie Charitable Trust was set up in 1988 by the late Eunice Rodie to recognize and perpetuate the shared interest of herself and Fred in the South Taranaki Community. Fred and Eunice Rodie were both from local families and lived and worked in the South Taranaki Community. In absence of family of their own, Fred and Eunice generously donated substantial assets within their charitable trust for the benefit of the wider community. Fred's father was Station Master of the Hawera Railway Station and his brother Town Clerk at Manaia. Eunice Nicholas grew up in Caledonia Street, Her father John was a beekeeper.

Fred and Eunice lived in Kaponga where Fred was Branch Manager of Newton King Ltd. In 1948 they moved to Hawera as Fred became Manager of the Hawera branch. Eunice did secretarial work for Walkley and Laurance Accountants in Hawera. They bought a farm on the Skeet Road and one on the Auroa Road. Throughout their lives they both took a great interest in the farming operations. Fred being a meticulous manager and record keeper in his work and farming operations.

They were kind, friendly, private people who enjoyed being involved. Fred was very involved with Rotary and contributed generously to many worthy causes in our local community, for example; to the Rotary organised Intensive Care and Scanner Trusts, and a Hall of Residence at Massey University. Eunice was very involved in the St Mary's Church and for a number of years was Fellowship Secretary.

Fred retired from Newton King when he was 60 in 1970. He and Eunice continued to live in their 57 Disraeli Street home (next to Bayly Park) until Fred died in 1974. Eunice soon after moved into a unit in Argyle Street until her health required admission to Calvery/Trinity rest home/hospital. Fred Rodie Born 1910 died 1974. Eunice Luxford Rodie Born 1910 died 2000.
