CONDITIONS

1. All Riders, Horses & Ponies must compete with the appropriate ESNZ membership.
2. All classes run under current ESNZ rules.
3. All classes in draw order, if you don't present to the gate on time without prior approval from the steward you will be eliminated.
4. Formal attire unless directed by the judge.
5. **GENERAL ENQUIRIES to:** Show Secretary Angela Sharples at sharples@farmside.co.nz or Debbie Tye at debslater@hotmail.com or phone 0274 998040 after 5:30pm.
6. **CLASS 6 – WP Equestrian Rising Stars 80cm Pony Invitational.** This class aims to encourage riders starting their show jumping careers. Riders will be invited to participate from those eligible who have competed in Classes 11, 12 & 13. Please indicate on entry if you would like to participate in this class. The rider may not have competed above 1m in the current or previous season. Every future superstar will be paired with a current superstar who will act as a mentor. This class will be organised by Mikayla Herbert, a local rider who won Lady Rider of the Year at Horse of the Year 2019 and represented NZ at the 2019 FEI World Jumping Challenge Final in Quito, Ecuador.

ENTRIES

7. **ONLINE ENTRIES AT:** www.evoevents.co.nz
8. **CLOSE OF ENTRIES:** Sunday 19th September, thereafter **LATE**. The committee reserves the right to close entries as numbers are restricted by the available time.
9. **LATE ENTRIES:** \$20 late fee for horses not entered in show. Will start first in the class where class is drawn according to ESNZ rules.
10. **PAYMENT:** Payment is with entry by POLI pay or credit card on Equestrian Entries at the time of finalising entry. Please direct any questions to the Show Secretary. Direct credit payment for non-finalised entries to Rotorua SJ Group 03-1552-0118642-000. Payment must be received by Tuesday 21st September or entries are **LATE**.
11. **CHANGES TO ENTRIES:** Class changes and late entries allowed but must be completed online via Evoevents by 7pm the previous evening.
12. **SCRATCHINGS:** No refund on admin fee or late entry fees. Class and all other fees including stabling are refunded in full up until Tuesday 21st September. Contact Angela at sharples@farmside.co.nz. No refunds for scratching or unused yards without a vet or medical certificate after this time.

LEVIES & FEES

13. **ESNZ JUMPING LEVY:** \$5 per equine for the show (compulsory).
14. **ESNZ CASUAL JUMPING LEVY:** \$20 per equine per show. Required for horses not currently registered with ESNZ for Jumping/Show Hunter. May not compete in any series class or at heights above 1.10m for horses and 1m for ponies. **NOTE:** the rider **must** be a full member of ESNZ.
15. **INTRODUCTORY CLASSES:** May be ridden by riders with an Introductory Membership or with a Casual Membership at \$10 per day.
16. **SHOW LEVY:** \$30 per horse.
17. **MEDIC FEE:** \$15 per rider.
18. **TAUPO NEC FACILITIES FEE:** \$30 per horse.
19. **YARDING:** Open yards - \$30 per horse for the show; Covered yards/Stable block - \$50 per horse for the show. Paddocks - \$30 per horse for the show (minimum 2 horses per paddock). Day yards - \$5 per horse per day. Yard enquiries to Mikayla Herbert at 027 775 0849. Calls after 5.30pm only please. Please note on entry if you own lease yards and the number owned. **NOTE:** NEC Taupo H&S policy specifically states that horses must not be tied up to trucks or floats at any time. You **MUST** book a day yard.
20. **CAMPING:** \$30 per truck - no power. Powered site \$50 per connection (limited availability). Powered camping sites allocated on entry with preference for those with medical conditions requiring power.

OTHER

21. Reminder ESNZ rules state that all horses must have a **phone number and person responsible on a tag** on the head collar or cover.
22. Practice ring on Friday \$10 per round. Not judged. Enter on Evoevents.
23. There will be food available on the grounds.
24. The Organising Committee reserves the right to alter the programme and prize money. Riders will be advised about any changes via email so please ensure your contact details are up to date.
25. All competitors must familiarise themselves with the health and safety policy in this schedule and sign the H & S event waiver on entry.

HEALTH & SAFETY POLICY

Ray White Spring Show, run by the Rotorua Show Jumping Group (RSJG), is committed to providing and maintaining a safe and healthy event for all staff, and to providing the information, training and supervision needed to achieve this. We will take all practicable steps by:

- Providing a safe event, safe equipment, and proper materials.
- Identifying and monitoring hazards and using the hazard management hierarchy of *eliminate, isolate, or minimise*.
- Insisting upon establishment of safe methods and best practices.
- Complying with all H&S legislation, regulations, and codes of practice. **NOTE:** NEC H&S policy specifically states that horses must not be tied up to trucks or floats at any time.

We will take responsibility for health and safety procedures, however, **ALL PEOPLE ON THIS SITE** need to be aware of their responsibilities and comply with the event's health and safety policy. **EVERY PERSON** involved in Ray White Spring Show is encouraged to play a vital and responsible role in maintaining a safe and healthy event through:

- Being involved in the event health and safety system.
- Following correct procedures.
- Ensuring safe and proper use of equipment.
- Wearing protective clothing and equipment as and when required.
- Reporting any pain or discomfort as soon as possible.
- **Ensuring ALL accidents and incidents are reported to the Health & Safety Officer** at the Office.
- Helping new employees, trainees, and visitors to understand the safety procedures and why they exist.
- **Informing the office immediately of any health and safety concerns.**
- Keeping the event facilities tidy to minimise the risk of any trips and falls.

COMPETITORS are responsible for themselves at **ALL times** and must observe the safe practices and the rules/instructions relating to their competition.

In case of a fall of an athlete and/or horse at any time in the competition arena, in the practice arena, or elsewhere within the grounds of the event, the athlete must be checked by the event's medical service and the check recorded on your event medical check card before you are permitted to take part in the round in progress or in the next round or competition at the event (Article 224). The card must remain in your pocket and be presented to the gate steward or ground committee before continuing to compete. The horse must be cleared by the Veterinarian or President of the Ground Jury and one other official if the Veterinarian is not available, before the equine is permitted to take part in the next round or competition at the event (Article 224).

Ray White Spring Show complies with the ESNZ concussion policy. Riders who have a suspected concussion will be **removed from the event**. Riders who are concussed are often unaware of their symptoms and may want to continue riding. The Ground Jury at the event takes responsibility for the rider's wellbeing, assesses the rider and makes an informed choice about whether the rider should continue to ride or not – if any doubt the rider must be removed from the event as per the **Blue Card process** (outlined below). ESNZ's Blue Card process has been developed to keep riders safe and to support officials in their duty of care.

Blue Card process:

- Officials can exclude a rider from participating in a competition or entire event by issuing a Blue Card because the rider has received a serious injury, including concussion or suspected concussion.
- If a rider issued with a Blue Card at an event refuses to withdraw from the event, disciplinary action may be taken through the disciplinary process set out in the ESNZ general regulations.
- The Blue Card notice is logged on a rider's profile on ESNZ's database.
- A Blue Card means that a rider is stood down from all riding activities until clearance from a registered GP or registered medical specialist can be obtained.
- If a rider who has been issued with a Blue Card competes without first providing medical clearance, this may result in disciplinary action taken through the ESNZ disciplinary process set out in the ESNZ general regulations.
