A: EVENT RULES & POLICIES - SCHEDULE

1. EVERYONE MUST SIGN IN USING THE ONSIDE APP WHEN ENTERING THE PREMISES

The ONSIDE app can be downloaded from either Google Play or Apple App Store

2. EVENT CONDITIONS/RULES ACKNOWLEDGMENT: By making an entry on Evo Events, riders and/or persons responsible acknowledge they have read this schedule and agree to abide by all rules and conditions applicable to this event.

3. OFFICIAL EVENT START TIME: 7am Wednesday 19th March 2025.

This is the start time for the period of jurisdiction for all Equestrian Sport New Zealand (ESNZ) General Regulations, Veterinary Regulations and ESNZ Dressage rules and ESNZ Para Equestrian/Dressage rules but noting ESNZ Dressage Articles 420-430 Prohibited gear is not permitted from the time of arrival at the venue and not withstanding other rules and policies as in Para 3.

4. ESNZ RULES & POLICIES

Rules: All competitions will be run under the current version ESNZ GR's, VR's & ESNZ Rules for Dressage and ESNZ Para Equestrian Dressage and 2024 FEI GR, VR and Rules for Dressage where applicable. All ESNZ and ESNZ Dressage rules, Para Equestrian/Dressage Rules and policies which apply at all times and /or from time of arrival on the grounds, including but not limited to: Welfare of the Horse, ESNZ Code of Conduct, ESNZ Behaviour Policy, instruction from members of the organising committee, prohibited gear, horse welfare, etc are applicable prior to the official event start time. ESNZ Members are responsible for the behaviour of any non-members that are associated with their entry eg grooms, family members, support team.

5. SCHEDULE AMENDMENTS:

ESNZ Dressage & the OC reserves the right to alter the programme/schedule and/or prize money within the ESNZ GR's/ESNZ Dressage & ESNZ Para Dressage Rules.

6. PROTESTS & COMPLAINTS: Please refer to the ESNZ General Regulations (current as at date of event) for the process for lodging protests or complaints. No protest or complaint will be accepted unless this process is followed. The official finish time of the event is sixty minutes after the completion of the last scheduled official activity of the event including any prize giving.

7. HEALTH & SAFETY

ESNZ Dressage is committed to providing and maintaining a safe and healthy event for all participants, and to providing the information, training and supervision needed to achieve this.

- a. All competitors and visitors to the venue must abide by the ESNZ/Dressage NZ and Fiber Fresh National Equestrian Centre Health & Safety Policies and the Health & Safety at Work Act 2015.
- b. Copies of the event Health & Safety policy can be found at the event office.
- c. Any incident or near miss must be reported to event office and incident form completed.
- d. Any hazards identified must be reported to Event Office or the Fiber Fresh National Equestrian Centre Office.
- e. Competitors will be responsible for their safety at all times and must observe safe practices and following event rules and officials' instructions at all times, ensuring that others are not put at risk by their actions.

8. ESNZ CONCUSSION POLICY

- a. This event will be run under the ESNZ Concussion Policy Guidelines.
- b. Dressage NZ policy requires all riders to report to Medical Officer or Steward following a fall.
- c. Medical clearance must be obtained before remounting or leaving the grounds.

9. EVENT LIABILITY

- a. ESNZ, ESNZ Dressage, ESNZ Para Equestrian, ESNZ Fiber Fresh National Equestrian Centre (Taupo), or any representative of these bodies, accepts no liability for any loss, damage, injury or illness to horse/pony/rider, spectator, vehicles or any personal property whether caused by their negligence or breach of contract in any way whatsoever. Competitors and spectators attending this event do so at their own risk.
- b. Safety of Property: ESNZ, ESNZ Dressage, ESNZ Para Equestrian, ESNZ National Equestrian Centre (Taupo), or any representative of these bodies, do not accept any liability for the safety of any goods/equipment or the loss of, or damage to such, brought in/stored at the venue, at the event. This includes stock / goods at trade stands.
- c. Damage: Any damage to facilities must be reported to the National Equestrian Centre Office or the Event Office immediately.

10. SPONSORS

11. ESNZ DRUG & ALCOHOL POLICY

ESNZ reserve the right to drug or alcohol test any participant at the event under the ESNZ Drug & Alcohol Policy 2019. This link will access the policy and frequently asked question. https://www.nzequestrian.org.nz/esnz/rules-regulations/esnz-rules/

12. COVID 19 POLICY

This event will be run under any New Zealand Government Covid 19 policies which may be applicable at the date of the event. Please be aware of any isolation periods required should you test positive leading into the event.

13. PROFESSIONAL SERVICES

a. Equine Therapists and Treatment

i) Equine therapists or practitioners who are not veterinarians and intend to provide therapeutic treatment to equines at the event must register their attendance with the Organising Committee / FEI Vet Delegate prior to any treatment to the event.

Only permitted Equine Therapists are permitted to carry out restricted therapies, must be appropriately qualified in the field they are offering services and should be able to provide verification to OC/stewards if requested.

ii) Athletes, Persons responsible and their support team (other persons responsible) are permitted to carry out non-restricted therapies with their own equipment (e.g. Equissage, Cyclossage or similar) and are only permitted to treat their own horses with these systems.

b. Other Professionals / Traders/Photographers

Any other party wishing to provide services or trade of any kind at this event must obtain prior agreement from the Organising Committee and may be required to pay a fee. This excludes professional Dressage Coaches assisting in the warmup of competitors and grooms that are in part or full-time employment of a competitor.

14. MEDIA & PUBLICITY

ESNZ Dressage NZ reserves the right to use event photographs for marketing, publicity, advertising, funding applications and other promotions as they see fit. ESNZ Dressage reserves the right to record and broadcast via live stream or any other type of digital broadcast any or all of the competition at the Bates Saddles National Dressage Championships 2025, both during and after the event. Competitions and/or participants will receive no remuneration for this. All footage remains the property of ESNZ Dressage. The copyright of all photographer's work must always be respected by competitors and their associates during and after the event and may not be used without permission of the photographer.

B: ENTRIES – ELIGIBILTY - QUALIFICATIONS

1. QUALIFICATION:

- a. Combinations must achieve one minimum score of 60% at one of the Premier League Events from 1st January 2024, or Bates National Championships March 2024 (incl Freestyle) in the level which they wish to contest the championship in March 2025. (Overall score not from an individual judge)
- b. CDIY combinations must have scored 60% in Level 7 or above. (FEI Young Rider tests, PSG, Inter I, Inter I FS,) Riders from the beginning of calendar year they turn 16 to end of calendar year they turn 21.
- c. CDIJ combinations must have scored 60% in Level 5 or above. Riders from the beginning of calendar year they turn 14 to end of calendar year they turn 18.
- d. **Combinations** may only enter either the CDIY **OR** CDIJ.
- e. Combinations in the FEI level pony classes must have qualified at Elementary grade or above. The grade of pony is unrestricted. Downgraded ponies are eligible (refer Annex A3 Dressage Rules-Rider Age Group Competitions & DR Art411.8)
- f. **Young Dressage Horse:** Young Dressage Horses do not need to qualify but must have proof of age & breeding ESNZ verified, by date of close of entry or entry will be invalidated and no entry refund will be applied
- g. Para Dressage: Refer to Para Equestrian Schedule for qualification as set by ESNZ Para Equestrian.
- h. If a combination also qualifies in a higher level they can compete in the lower level providing they have not upgraded and become ineligible by earning more than 30pts in the higher level. Combinations who have qualified and are eligible for two levels may only compete in championship qualifiers for one grade.
- i. In principle a maximum 40 entries per grade up to Advanced Medium will be accepted in order of receipt. If any class is over subscribed, combinations will be waitlisted and accepted in order of receipt.
- j. Final qualifier 15th -16th February 2025 at Taupo (Waikato Champs)

2. ENTRIES: Close 8pm Wednesday 19th February 2025

- a. All entry payments must be made at time of entry via Poli-Pay ONLY or Internet Banking by request.
- b. Entries will not be accepted as final without payment of all fees. ESNZ registrations and dressage annual horse/pony start must be valid until 22nd March 2025. (Refer DR Art's 401-408)
- c. **FEI Entries**: CDI 3*/Y/J: Please ensure FEI horse and rider registrations are valid for 2025 by Monday 10th February to enable FEI entries to be loaded into the FEI entry system by the OC.
- d. If any class is oversubscribed, further entries will be put on a waitlist. Any combination on a waitlist who does not get a start will receive a refund.
- e. Upgradings: Must be notified to the Entry Secretary within two working days of the horse upgrading and changes requested on EvoEvents. Failure to do so prior to the event will result in no refund and additional entry fees charged.
- f. Entry Changes: Requests for class changes after close of entry may be made via EvoEvents but will be subject to the approval of the OC. A fee of \$25 per class will be applicable if approved unless the horse has upgraded and becomes ineligible.

3. Downgraded Horses/Ponies:

Downgraded horses/ponies may compete within twelve months of being downgraded but may not contest ESNZ Dressage Open Championship titles and ESNZ National Trophies.

Explanation: DR Art 411 specifies that downgraded horses or ponies may not contest any National Championship within twelve months of downgrading. Downgraded horses and ponies may compete in all competitions (classes) but are not eligible for any open championship points. If qualified, they can compete for Silver/Bronze Championship. **Super 5 League:** Downgraded horses and ponies may compete in Super 5 League finals but may not gain series points

within 12 months of being downgraded.

4. Horses / Ponies may be entered in one level only with the following exceptions:

- Young Dressage Horse Championships plus an open Grade or Silver / Bronze Championship
- Super 5 League Finals Horses ponies may contest more than one final if they qualified by competing in that league during the season. SI combinations may contest the NI Final but will not earn series points.
- 5. Combinations may only compete in Para Dressage Classes or Dressage Classes for the duration of the event not both.

- **6. Helen Holden Memorial Trophy Area Teams**: Entries must be nominated by Area Delegates or their official representative and emailed to the Entries Manager by 5pm Wednesday 19th March or completed and handed in to the event office secretary by 5pm Wednesday 19th March .
- 7. Special Awards: All nominations for Special Awards must be submitted on EvoEvents by entry closing date and will not be accepted at the event (Refer to pages 16- 17 for Special Awards)
- **8. Non-Competing/Nonregistered horses:** Special permission must be sought at time of entry for non-competing/nonregistered horses to be at the venue any time during the competition. This permission will be considered on a case by case basis. Covered yards/stables will not be given priority to horses not entered at the event.

9. SILVER BRONZE CLASSIFICATIONS

Please refer to rules which can be found Annex 8 page 70 of the DNZ 2024 rule book or at: A8 Gold Silver Bronze.pdf (nzequestrian.org.nz)

10. CHAMPIONSHIP POINTS **NEW FOR 2025**

- a. Open Championship for levels 1-9, FEI Young Rider Challenge, FEI Junior Challenge & FEI Pony Challenge will be determined from Rounds 1, 2 & 3. Points are allocated 20 for 1st, to 1 for 20th in Round 1, 2 & 3.
- b. Bronze & Silver Championship will be determined by the highest total % from Rounds 1 & 2 ONLY.
- c. To be eligible for Open Championship, FEI Young Rider Challenge, FEI Junior Challenge & FEI Pony Challenge points, combinations must contest Rounds 1, 2 & 3.
- d. Open Champions, and FEI Young Rider Challenge, FEI Junior Challenge, & FEI Pony Challenge winners and reserves: The horse with the highest aggregate allocated points from specified classes will be the overall winner. In the event of a tie, the combination with the highest place in the final qualifier is the winner. If there is still a tie, the winner will be the combination with the highest aggregate collective marks in the final qualifier. (The final qualifier is deemed to be the test ridden on Saturday)
- e. If there is a further tie, the combination with the highest average % over days 2 and 3 will be the winner.

C: REFUNDS – PRIZE MONEY

1. REFUND POLICY EVENT CANCELLATION

Should the Covid levels change meaning the event cannot continue, or other force majeure or circumstance/s beyond the control of ESNZ Dressage result in any or all of the event, refunds will be applied as follows:

- a. Cancellation of show before close of entries full refund of all class entry fees, and stabling/camping fees. No refund of Admin or EVO Event Fees
- b. Cancellation notified after close of entries but on or before Monday 10th March 2025 full refund of all stabling/camping fees, 50% refund of class entry fees, no refund of Admin or EvoEvents Fees.
- c. Cancellation notified on or after 11th March 2025 full refund of all stabling/camping fees, refund of class entry fee at OC discretion, no refund of Admin or Evo Event Fees.

2. GENERAL REFUND POLICY for WITHDRAWALS

Requests for refunds will only be accepted if:

- a. Scratchings prior close of entry are submitted on EvoEvents and followed up with a refund application form emailed to the entries manager by entry close date 19th February 2025: Refund all fees except a \$40.00 Admin Fee and online fees. Refunds paid by 4th March 20. No Vet or Dr Certificate required.
- b. All scratchings after close of entry subject to non-refundable \$70 Admin fee plus as paras 3-5
- c. Scratchings on or after 19th February 2025 and that are submitted on EvoEvents and followed up with a refund application form emailed to the entries manager on or before 20th March 2024: Refund 50% entry fees and all stabling and Camping. No Vet or Dr Certificate required. Refunds paid after event.

- d. Scratchings on or after 17th March 2025 must be submitted on EvoEvents and followed up with a refund application form emailed to the entries manager on or before 1st April 2025. 50% entry fees and all camping and stabling
- e. CDI3* & CDIY CDIJ: Vet or Dr Certificate required. At the event permission must be given by FEI Ground Jury to withdraw.
- f. CDI3*: Scratchings FEI Grand Prix classes 75% of entry fees and all camping and stabling refunded.
- g. Refund paid after event.
- h. Any horse who does not qualify for the FEI GP Freestyle will automatically be entered in the National Freestyle. May apply for 50% refund (\$150) by 1st April 2025 on official refund form.
- i. Scratchings during the event should be made at the office by completing the "during competition" form.

3. PRIZE MONEY – PRIZES – TIES - PRESENTATIONS

- a. Prize Money: DR article 481 & Under Special Conditions Art 407 Prize money for the event is awarded under special conditions for the event as approved by the Dressage NZ Board Special Conditions: Where specified in the schedule of classes, Championship Prize Money (or goods to equal value or greater, will be paid on Championship points (not individual classes).
- b. The OC reserves the right to amend/limit the number of prizes or prize money if less than eight starters in any championship or class. Up to 3 starters, 1st only; 4-5 starters 1st & 2nd; 6-8 starters 1st 3rd; 9 or more 1st 4th, and/or pay prize money which is less than the entry fee for 1st 4th place winners.
- c. The OC reserves the right to adjust the advertised Prize Money.
- d. Prizes to equal or greater value may be substituted for Prize Money in any class or championship.
- e. **Equal Placings**: (DR Art 480) In the case of equality in any (national) class at this event. The higher collective marks will determine the higher placing. If the competitors are still equal, then the higher co-efficient marks will determine the placings. If there is still an equality of points, the competitors are given the same placing.

f. Equal Placings YDH Classes

In case of equality of percentage for the first three (3) places, the following system must be used to break the tie: add the marks for "submission" and "perspective" and divide by two; the Athlete/Horse combination with the higher average mark will be ranked highest.

If still tied, the "submission" mark will decide. If still tied, the combinations will be equally placed.

g. Equal Placings CDI 3*/Y/J (Ref FEI Rules)

In case of equality of percentage for the first three (3) places, the highest total median score of the Judges will decide the placing. The median score is the middle number.

To calculate the median of a set of scores, the scores need to be put in ascending numerical order.

E.g. 68.5% - 69% - 70% - 70.5% - 71%; 70% is the median score in this case.

- h. **Ties in Freestyle:** In case of equality of percentage in a Freestyle Test for the first three (3) places, the higher artistic marks will decide on the better placing. Should the artistic mark be the same, the higher mark for harmony will decide. If still tied the higher mark for choreography will decide.
- i. **Presentation of Prizes:** Approximate presentation times will be advised in the rider notes and are subject to change at any time, please check at the event office for updates. The organising committee reserves the right to withhold prize monies or prizes/trophies should a place getter not attend an advertised prize giving. Only Riders with conflicting classes may nominate another person to the Prize Giving Co-ordinator to collect prizes/rosettes at the prizegiving. This also applies to series winners and place winners.

D: STABLE & YARD ALLOCATIONS

The OC requests that all riders respect that there is limited covered horse accommodation at the venue. Every effort will be made by the OC to allocate preferred accommodation. In some instances, this may not be possible. Allocations will be made in principle as follows:

- PRIORITY BOOKINGS HELD ONLY UNTIL 5th February 2025.
 Entries must be submitted and paid by this date otherwise priority status does not apply. No Exceptions
 A number of stables and covered yards will be reserved for and allocated to CDI 3*/ Y/J horses and associated team horses, stallions, National Equestrian Centre lease holders (all Levels), South Island combinations (all levels) and those from north of Whangarei (all levels), and Advanced to Grand Prix level horses. It will be notified on the Bates Nationals Facebook page as soon as possible when covered accommodation is full. Riders may request an upgrade should covered yards become available after this time.
- 2. Horses entered in FEI Competitions will be stabled in the same block/s and every effort will be made to accommodate national horses in the same team as close as possible. The OC is bound by FEI rules.
- 3. **Note to National Equestrian Centre lease holders:** Your lease must be current at time of entry, until the 23rd March 2025 or preferred yarding will not be allocated.
- 4. Any non-allocated stables / covered yards as above will be allocated in order of receipted / paid entry from the entry opening day. Therefore, competitors from Prelim to Advanced Medium who require covered horse accommodation should enter as soon as possible after entry opening date.
- 5. The OC will endeavor to keep horses from the same rider, team or family together, but this is not guaranteed.
- 6. Competitors who live within 45 minutes of the venue are encouraged to return to their home base if possible please to assist the covered yards availability for further away competitors except FEI horses.

E: IMPORTANT GENERAL EVENT CONDITIONS

- 1. **Communication:** Prior to the event communications with riders re-entries will be made via EvoEvents. Please make sure you check your emails sent from the entry platform. **Please note that public Wi-Fi is not available at the Fiber Fresh NEC.** Riders may be texted with urgent messages at the event.
- 2. **Championship results:** These will be posted outside the office as soon as possible and NOT advised via facebook.
- 3. **Prohibited Saddlery:** ESNZ Dressage Articles 420-430 Prohibited gear is not permitted from the time of arrival at the venue.
- 4. **Riding Helmets:** ESNZ yellow tagged approved riding helmets must be worn at all times when mounted at the National Equestrian Centre.
- 5. **Horse/Pony ID Numbers (DR Art 429):** Approved Horse/Pony official identification numbers must be worn on both sides of the horse/pony at all times during warm up and competition, and when being ridden or led in arena familiarization. ID Tag with Horse Name, Rider phone contact must be worn in or out of the stable/yard at all other times.
- 6. **Commanded Tests:** All tests must be ridden from memory, unless
 - a. a commander is appointed for any young horse class,
 - b. or an athlete has an approved dispensation,
 - c. or a Para athlete has compensating aid approval,

7. **DRAW:** Draw for all days will be available prior to the event by email and web site www.evovents.co.nz

Daily Draw Friday/Saturday If required, a revised draw and/or start times for the following day's competition will be available by 6.30 pm at event administration office and updated on EvoEvents. There will also be a copy posted at the stable area. The OC reserves the right to alter the draw/programme to ensure the smooth running of the event. It is the rider's responsibility to check for any new times posted.

Multiple Horses: Riders with more than 2 horses: The OC will make every effort to ensure that riders have at least 60 minutes between tests. However, if this is not possible owing to the scheduling of classes, the maximum time possible between tests will be allocated.

8. **Music for all Freestyle Classes**. All riders must upload their music to EvoEvents by e music for their freestyle by **Wednesday 12**th **March 2025** A wav. file is the preferred format (best quality) however an mp3 file is also acceptable.

Note: This upload is event specific so you will need to upload to this event even if you have uploaded to a previous event.

Procedure on EVOEVENTS

- 1. Select the event.
- 2. Click the 'More' button.
- 3. Enter a description for the music.
- 4. Select the file type called "Music for MFS".
- 5. Select the class and horse
- 6. Select the file to upload from your own computer.
- 7. Press the 'Upload Your Document' button.

GENERAL VENUE CONDITIONS

Stables, Yards & Wash Down Bays

- 1. Moving horses to yards or stables not prior allocated to those horses is prohibited without permission of the Stable Manager
- 2. Any temporary yarding supplied by competitors must comply with ESNZ rules location to be approved by Stable Manager
- 3. All yards and stables are to be left clean, free of all horse waste & hay and properly mucked out. A \$100 administration and cleaning fee will apply if left uncleaned. It is recommended all riders take a photo of their cleaned out yard clearly showing their yard number on departure
- 4. All stable muck to be disposed of on muck heaps.
- 5. Please use the wheelie bins provided for rubbish only.
- 6. Keep wash down bays clean at all times.
- 7. No smoking or vaping in any Fiber Fresh NEC buildings or stable & covered yard areas.
- 8. Please note it is a Fiber Fresh NEC Health & Safety requirement that ALL horses/ponies at events are allocated stables, paddocks or yards and tying to trucks or floats is not permitted (except for saddling up etc. but must not be left unattended). Horses must not be tied to the wire of the uncovered yards.

Dogs

- 1. Dogs must be kept in the truck park and on a lead at all times.
- 2. No dogs are allowed in any stable or yarding areas, warm up, competition areas or buildings.
- 3. The owner of the dog will be responsible for the cost of any damage/harm caused by the dog at the competition.
- 4. Failure to comply with the above rulings will result in a \$100 fine which must be paid for by the dog owner.
- 5. This owner must pay this fine to be allowed to continue riding in the competition.

Vehicles

- 1. All entry by Gate 3 off Rapids Rd.
- 2. Please ensure any gates into or at the venue are closed after entry or exit.
- 3. There is no vehicle access or parking around the stadium area except for accredited officials and service vehicles. All other visitors must park in designated car parks. The OC reserves the right to limit parking in vicinity of the stables to horse transport vehicles only.
- 4. Speed limit for all vehicles 15 kph in all locations.
- 5. Motorbikes must not be used before 6.00am or after 8.00 pm and must be used in accordance with normal road rules. Approved safety helmets must be worn when riding motorbikes at all times. Persons under 16 years may not use a motorbike.
- 6. Safety helmets must always be worn by all persons on a push bike.

Camping & Power Sites

- 1. Parking and camping areas will be defined. Some areas will be restricted to onsite camping/parking only.
- 2. Day competitors must park in designated day parking areas.
- 3. Trucks and Campervans will be allocated specific powered sites and must have a valid electrical certificate and under no circumstances may permit other vehicles to connect to their vehicle via extension cords.
- 4. If you intend booking a caravan or similar for the event, you must notify the Event Secretary to ensure that a powered site is available for you. Caravans delivered onsite without this prior notification will be asked to leave.
- 5. Waste and grey water tanks must only be emptied in the wastewater dump adjacent to ablution block near the truck park.
- 6. Please be tidy and use green wheelie bins for all rubbish no animal waste in green bins.

Combinations intending to compete at the ESNZ Para Equestrian Dressage National level competition (Refer to Annex 2) are required to have competed at two different Training (TE), Local (LE), Regional (RE)or National Para Equestrian events in their classified grade on the horse/s they wish to compete in the 12 months prior to the start date of the event. (since 20/3/24)
- 6. Combinations intending to compete at a Para Equestrian to enter the Para Equestrian classes at a National event (Refer to Annex 2) must also have qualified as a combination with a score of 57% or higher achieved in the FEI Para Grand Prix Test A or FEI Para Grand Prix Test B for their Grade in the 12 months prior to the start date at any Local (LE), Regional (RE) or National level Para Equestrian Dressage event sanctioned by Dressage NZ and/ or ESNZ Para Equestrian and run under ESNZ Para Equestrian Rules.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY:

Refer to General Conditions for the event plus for Para Classes please note:

- 1. These conditions are to be read in conjunction with the remainder of this event schedule and all conditions apply to Para Equestrian entries.
- 2. This event is run under ESNZ Para-Equestrian Rules, ESNZ General Rules and Regulations and DNZ Dressage Rules.
- 3. All competitors must be current ESNZ full riding or child members current until 23rd March 2025 at the time of entry.
- 4. All horse registrations must be current to 23rd March 2025 at the time of entry.
- 5. All horses must have a dressage annual start current until 23rd March 2025 at the time of entry.
- 6. ESNZ, Dressage NZ & ESNZ Para-Equestrian rules apply from time of arrival. Official event start time as stated in this schedule.
- 7. Combinations (athlete and named horse) competing at National Dressage Championships or Horse of the Year Show are required to enter either Para or Able Bodied competition NOT both. Art 162.6.3
- 8. Maximum number of tests per day.
 - a. Under FEI Rules athletes may compete in a maximum of 2 tests per day per horse.
 - b. Horses may compete in a maximum of 2 tests per day across Para & Able-Bodied Dressage classes.
 - c. Shared para equestrian horses in all grades may compete in a maximum of 3 tests per day unless specifically stated by the OC of the event.
- All Riders are to display the Official Orange Para Badge on each side of their saddle cloth at all timeswhile schooling, hacking or competing as well as the horse's ESNZ registration number on both sidesof the bridle or saddle cloth.
- 10. All tests are the current 2023 versions that are at FEI.org Para Dressage Tests | FEI
- 11. A horse may not be shared by different riders between PE & AB classes.
- 12. A horse may be shared by riders of different Grades in Para classes as per Article 125.
- 13. Depending on indoor timetable requirements classes may be held in a different daily order.
- 14. A Riders' Briefing will be held time and place to be advised. All riders are required to attend.
- 15. All Three Tests count toward the title for each grade as per Article 144.
- 16. The Hunniman Trophy to be awarded to the combination with the highest aggregate % from all three tests.
- 17. Prize giving times to be confirmed and will be announced during the event.

PARA EQUESTRIAN TEAMS EVENT

- 1. Open to all riders entering the Para Equestrian classes. If riders wish to not participate then please notify in the General Comments section of your entry.
- 2. Teams of 3 riders.
- 3. Team will be randomly selected at the close of entries via an online team selector.

- 3. A maximum of 1 young rider from classes 911, 912 **or** pony rider from classes 934, 935 **or** junior rider from classes 924,925
- 4. One rider may only compete on one horse, unless an area only has three riders, and then one rider may enter two horses.
- 5. Qualifying classes are the two Bates championship classes in each grade, the Pony, Junior and Young Rider Individual & Freestyle Tests
- 6. All horses and riders in each team must be from the same area, except that, if an area has insufficient riders competing at the Championships, up to two volunteer combinations from another area may be used provided they are not already in a team.
- 7. South Island riders may enter a composite Island team in addition to a SI Area team if there are insufficient competitors to make further area teams but team composition conditions apply as above.
- 8. Points allocated are 10 for 1st, 9 for 2nd down to 1 for 10th. Placings lower than 10th are not allocated points.
- 9. In the event of a tie, the combined points of the three highest placed horses in each team will count. If there is still a tie, the combined points of the two highest placed horses in each team will count. If there is still a tie, all team members will be allocated a point for the grade they competed in and the highest points will win, eg Preliminary 1pt. Grand prix = 9pts
- 10. Team entries must be submitted by Wednesday 19th March 2025 at 5pm to the Entries Manager by email, natchapentries@gmail.com or delivered to the event secretary's office by 5pm Wednesday.
- 11. No substitutions permitted after the commencement of the event on Thursday morning. Substitutions only permitted in the case of team horse or rider withdrawal owing to injury or illness and must be verified by the area.
- 12. Teams must be nominated by area dressage groups and entry form signed by two area officials.
