Requirements to Upgrade to F-Level

(Minimum age – 18 years)

All pre requisite forms are available on the ESNZ website http://www.nzequestrian.org.nz/disciplines/dressage/resources

In order to progress to the next level you need to undertake the following

- **Required Judging** candidates are required to judge 5 Official DNZ competitions, at their current level. The minimum number of horses to be judged overall is 24 horses. This judging must be completed **BEFORE** commencing any of the pre requisites to upgrade
- Shadow Judging
 - Minimum of three entire Novice competitions with at least 10 horses in each competition (a total of 30 horses to be judged overall) Note: In order to judge the required minimum number of horses if may be necessary to judge more competitions
 - Supervising judge/s to be an appointed Judge Educator or Mentor
 - > Shadow judging assessment form to be completed on each occasion
- Sit-Ins
 - > Complete two assessed sit-ins with an approved Judge Educator or Mentor
 - > Sit-In assessment form to be completed on each occasion

• Other Requirements

- > Attend a seminar that includes G or F-level
- > Complete and pass the Novice theory exam (closed rule book) with a pass mark of at least 80%
- > Pass the Novice practical exam at least 15 horses to be judged

Upon satisfactory completion of all of the above, you will be accredited at F-level and will be eligible to judge Official competitions up to and including Novice level.

In order to remain accredited on the National judges list you must meet compulsory judging activity and professional development requirements every 3 years. Further information on this can be found on the ESNZ website and will be sent when accredited as an F Level Judge.

Once again, ESNZ thank you for enquiring about becoming a Dressage judge. We urge you to take the first step and become a G-Level (Preliminary judge), take the levels one step at a time and enjoy the knowledge that you will gain, and the colleagues that you will meet.
