

FEI CSI1* Competitions – Information document

(Updated March 2020)

This information document should be read in conjunction with the FEI Jumping Rules & General regulations

Applications & administration to conduct a CSI1* competition

- All organising committees of CSI1* classes must be affiliated to ESNZ.
- Organising fee, calendar fee and anti-doping fees are required to run all CSI1* events.
- An FEI CSI1* competition is classified as a lower level event - **(FEI GRs Art 137.1 & Appendix E CIMs)**
- Fees below are subsidised by ESNZ Jumping.
 - **Organising dues per event - CHF 500 (Jumping to pay this fee)**
 - **Calendar registration per event - CHF 300 (OC to pay this fee)**
- Fees below to be collected by OC and forwarded to ESNZ
 - **FEI Start Fee per horse** (FEI Start fee of \$25NZD must be collected by the Organising committees and forwarded to ESNZ)
 - **Equine & human anti-doping program (EADCMP) per horse** (EADCMP fee of \$35NZD must be collected by Organising committees and forwarded to ESNZ)
- It is highly recommended that the Organising Committee use all FEI officials for the entire show and that they are compensated as such. Recommended compensation:
 - FEI Level 2 Course Designer - no fee on day of competition (see FEI Officials on page two of this document) plus accommodation.
 - FEI Level 1 Course Designer – for education purposes – no fee required, plus accommodation.
 - FEI Level 3,2,1 and National Judges \$100 per day, plus accommodation.
 - FEI Chief Steward and FEI Level 1,2 stewards \$100 per day, plus accommodation.
 - Technical delegate \$100 per day, plus accommodation
- FEI Code of Conduct MUST be visible at all times during the show and if possible printed in show programmes. Code of Conduct is available from ESNZ Jumping or the FEI website.

- All athlete/horse combinations must be entered by ESNZ Jumping through the FEI online entry system. OC/Athletes must inform the Jumping sport manager names of athletes and horses to be entered.

FEI DRAFT SCHEDULE AND OFFICIALS

- Draft schedule to be sent by the ESNZ Jumping Sport Administrator to the FEI at least 14 weeks prior to event.
- ESNZ Technical committee/ESNZ Jumping Board in conjunction with Organising Committees will appoint all FEI Officials including Chief Steward & FEI Veterinary Delegate

FEI Officials (To be appointed by ESNZ Jumping in conjunction with the OC)

- President of the Ground Jury must be at least a FEI Level 3 Judge, plus 3 x FEI level 1 or 2 Judges or National taken from the FEI list of current judges.
 - FEI Level 2 Course Designer (*Please note: FEI Level 2 CDs will waive their course designing fee the day of this competition in lieu of ticking off compulsory upgrade requirements. The money saved can then be allocated by the OC towards FEI Fees*). It is highly recommended that the FEI Class Course Designer is the Ring 1 Course Designer for the entirety of the show. If the CSI 1* is running at the same show that is holding a World Cup Class, the CSI 1* Course Designer should be the Assistant Course Designer for the World Cup Course Designer.
- FEI Level 1 assistant course designer.
- FEI Veterinary Delegate to be taken from the NZL FEI list of approved Veterinary Delegates for Jumping.
- FEI permitted treating veterinarian taken from the NZL FEI list of Permitted Treating veterinarians. (*Veterinary Delegate and permitted treating veterinarian must not be the same*)
- Chief Steward minimum FEI level 2 plus 4 FEI stewards minimum Level 1 taken from the FEI list of International Stewards
- Technical Delegate - selected from the ESNZ Jumping list of TDs or Official National Course Designers

Prize money

- A minimum of \$1500 prize money must be paid.
- Prize money for each CSI1* competition must be distributed to 12th place regardless of the number of starters (*Annex VI – CSI requirements – Prize money distribution of the FEI Jumping Rules and Prize money chart (25%) in the Annexes to the FEI Schedule*)
- Should there not be 12 eligible place getters prize money must be redistributed to those eligible according to prize money chart of 25%

Competition format

- As follows and should be included verbatim in all Schedules

Art. 273.3.3.2, 273.2.2.1, 273.4.3 *Table A competition not against the clock (273.3.3.2) in the first round and against the clock in the second round. Athletes return for the second round in accordance with Art. 273.2.2.1 Athletes will be placed according to their aggregate penalties over both rounds and the time incurred in the second round. Athletes not taking part in the second round will be placed according to penalties incurred in the first round.*

Or

Art. 273 3.3.1, 273.2.2.2, 273.4.3 *Table A competition against the clock in the first round. Athletes return for the second round in accordance with Art 273 2.2.2. Athletes will be placed according to aggregate penalties over both rounds and time incurred in the second round. Athletes not taking part in the second round will be placed according to penalties and time in the first round.*

FEI Approved cups and timers

- Approved FEI safety cups must be used on all oxers and on both back elements of a triple bar, warm up arenas and all other obstacles where possible.
CARO cups are available from ESNZ Jumping for all CSI1* competitions.
- Electronic timing is compulsory and must be recorded to 1/100 of a second.
- Approved electronic timers must be used in all CSI* events. The ESNZ Jumping trailer should be used in all CSI 1* events.
- One of the following timers must be used at in all CSI1* competitions:
ESNZ Jumping timer: Manufacturer - TAG Heuer Model: CP540 FEI Report number: 22010028A
Lake Ridge Equestrian timer: Manufacturer: - TAG Heuer Model: TBC FEI Report number TBC

Rider Participation

- All competitors taking part in an a CSI1* must be FEI registered for the current year (***note: all FEI registrations expire 31st December each year regardless of when in the year they are processed***)
- All competitors must be current financial Full Members of ESNZ

Competitors may take part in CSI1* in the calendar year in which they reach the age of 14 years provided the height of the obstacles in the initial round do not exceed 1.40m (*FEI Jumping rules Art 255*)

- All Athletes are required to pay a human & athlete anti-doping program fee of CHF 18 per horse.

Horse participation and Identification

- All horses must be FEI registered for the current year (***note: all FEI registrations expire 31st December each year regardless of when in the year the ay are processed***)
- Must have either a current FEI Passport or an orange FEI approved National Identification book (***These are available from ESNZ and must be completed by a veterinarian and signed off by ESNZ prior to competition***)
- All horses must have a current ESNZ Equine registration with an annual start for ESNZ Jumping
- **All CSI1* horses must wear an ID number as per FEI rule Article 282**, a three-digit number must be allocated to each horse by the OC
- All horses taking part in CSI1* competitions must be at least 6 years of age (*FEI Jumping Rules Art 254 1.1*)
- If a CSI1* is held at a World Cup show, horses competing in the World Cup are unable to compete in the CSI1* (FEI Jumping Rules Annex VI CSI Requirements)

Horse Inspection & Medication Control

- Horse inspection (trot up) will be conducted on a suitable surface. Handler's attire at the trot up should be neat and tidy.
- Inspections are conducted by the FEI Veterinary delegate, President of the Ground Jury, Chief Steward and jury members if available. Either a valid FEI horse passport or FEI approved national identification book **MUST** be available for inspection.
- Boot & Bandage control may be carried out at CSI1* events on all participating horses. FEI Jumping rules Art 244
- Should there be testing at a CSI1* - Either a valid FEI passport or an FEI approved National identification book **MUST** be available for the testing official.
- Prize money for any horse tested will be withheld until results are returned.

Officials: Payment and Necessary Arrangements

- ESNZ will pay for flights and/or mileage for the following: President of Ground Jury/1st FEI Judge, 2nd FEI Judge, Course Designer, Assistant CD, Technical Delegate and Chief Steward. ESNZ will liaise with these officials regarding their travel arrangement to the show.
- The organising committee is responsible for picking up/dropping off officials from the airport and organising their accommodation.

- The organising committee is responsible for the payment of all other necessary officials.
- The organising committee is responsible for the cost of FEI Veterinary Delegate and the FEI permitted treating veterinarian.
