CONDITIONS FOR THE DERBY

Judged on the following elements, Jumping, Manners, Conformation & Type, and Way of Going.

1. To be judged in two phases. Phase One – Jumping, Phase Two – Flat section.
2. No restriction on gear except Bit less bridles are not permitted, and Draw reins (running reins, Market Harborough's) are forbidden. Boots may be used, but not permitted in Phase Two.
3. Whips not to exceed 75cm.
4. No gear changes between phases except boots must be removed for Phase 2.
5. The course may include a water jump. No time limit, hunting pace.
6. Phase 1 Jumping will be completed first. Any Pony/Horse eliminated will not be required for Phase 2.

Fall of Horse/Pony or Rider in either phases Elimination

No penalty is incurred if the lower pole in the same vertical plane is lowered. If a horse/pony positively stops or turns it's quarters to a fence or has a complete turnabout these constitute refusals. Horses/ponies displaying continued disobedience or horses/ponies leaving the ring whether mounted or dismounted will be eliminated. Any horse/pony taking the wrong course or

jumping another fence after completing the course will be eliminated.

TIE BREAKER

In the event of a tie or ties the mark MUST NOT be altered. The TOTAL MARK from PHASE 1 will take precedence, followed by the Manners mark, and then the Conformation Mark. If there is still a tie the Judge's decision is FINAL.

ENTRY CONDITIONS

Online entries close with Evo Events on the Friday 16th February, 2024.

All entries will be expected to pay at the time of entry and will not be confirmed until full payment has been received.

No postal or email entries will be accepted unless special arrangement has been made with the show secretary (jumpingwairapaevents@gmail.com).

Late entries may be accepted if there is capacity with 50% late entry fee till 5pm night before the class. This is at the discretion of the organising committee.

GENERAL CONDITIONS

1. All classes run under ESNZ rules.
2. Committee reserves the right to alter the programme.
3. Ring 1 to be run in strict draw order and takes precedence over other rings. Ring 2 will run in draw order when possible but there will be some flexibility if you are competing in ring 1 (within reason). Ring 3 will run in black board order.
4. Please ensure registrations and memberships are up to date. Failure to do so may result in loss of points, placing's, prize money after the show and may result in rider being fined under ESNZ Jumping conditions.
5. Horses/ponies can compete under casual levy system for non-series classes and no higher than 1.10m for horses and 1.00m for ponies but riders must be fully registered. Introductory members can only compete in INTRODUCTORY level classes (named INTRO).



6. The Committee reserves the right to refuse any entry. Committee reserves the right to evict and eliminate anyone who is acting in an unacceptable manner. Security may be patrolling the grounds.

8. Dogs must be on leads at all times.

9. Competitors enter at own risk and the organisers take no responsibility for any injury to horses, riders or spectators or any damage to competitors or spectators property.

10. SHOW HUNTER PONY EQUITATION – Riders may only enter one equitation class not both – (Class 54 or 65)

FEES AND LEVIES

- Ground Levy, \$25 per horse/pony.
- Medical fee, \$25 per rider.
- Camping fee \$10/per truck/float per night
- Stables/Covered Yards \$45 for show; Open yards \$30 for show. Preference will be given to those competing at higher levels, sponsors and volunteers.
- ESNZ Jumping levy \$7 per horse/pony (compulsory)
- ESNZ Casual Jumping Levy \$30.15 for horses and ponies not registered with ESNZ Jumping / Show Hunter for the show - Horses may compete at 1.10m and below and Ponies 1m and below but cannot start in any series classes. ESNZ Casual Membership \$16.30 for riders not registered with ESNZ, only able to compete in Introductory classes.
- Refunds less 25% if notified to the event secretary by 7:00 pm three days prior to the show. Refunds after that less 50% at the committee's discretion.
- Class changes - 10% retained and no late fee charged. LATE ENTRIES, SCRATCHINGS AND CHANGES IN ALL CLASSES NEED TO BE WITH THE SECRETARY BY 5:00PM THE NIGHT BEFORE (at the discretion of the organising committee) – late entries to ride first in draw order classes. Class changes should be completed online where possible.
- Riders MUST check with the office before they leave the show to ensure they do not owe money. Otherwise, a \$25 admin fee may be charged for follow-up of any outstanding fees after the show. Note - this show will use the ESNZ Jumping Policy on Debt Collection to follow-up any unpaid accounts. Read more on the ESNZ website or see the policy at the show.
- Prize money will be paid out by direct credit within 14 days after the show so be sure to include your bank details with the online entry. Riders are responsible for checking their placing's and prize money online within two days of the show's competition. No changes in prize money will be made after then.

STABLING CRITERIA

Stabling will be prioritised for those that have horses jumping 1.30 and above, the organising committee and sponsors of the show, at the discretion of the organising committee.

IMPORTANT NOTICE TO RIDERS ABOUT MEDIA

By entering or attending this competition, you accept that you may appear within differing media streams that are on location covering the event. Your behaviour at the event and within the competition arena is at your discretion and is your responsibility.

WAIRARAPA RIDERS

We really need local competitors to step up and help, so you will be asked to provide a volunteer at this show with a contact phone number, and a preference for set up, putting away, or at show duties, please be aware that your entry could be refused if not compliant.



HEALTH & SAFETY POLICY

Wairarapa Jumping Group are committed to providing and maintaining a safe and healthy event for everyone, and to providing the information, training and supervision needed to achieve this. We will take all practicable steps by:

- Providing a safe event, safe equipment, and proper materials.
- Identifying and monitoring hazards and using the hazard management hierarchy of eliminate, isolate, or minimise.
- Insisting upon establishment of safe methods and best practices.
- Complying with all H&S legislation, regulations, and codes of practice. We will take responsibility for health and safety procedures, however, ALL PEOPLE ON THIS SITE need to be aware of their responsibilities and comply with the event's health and safety policy. EVERY PERSON involved in our show is encouraged to play a vital and responsible role in maintaining a safe and healthy event through:
 - Being involved in the event health and safety system.
 - Following correct procedures.
 - Ensuring safe and proper use of equipment.
 - Wearing protective clothing and equipment as and when required.
 - Reporting any pain or discomfort as soon as possible.
 - Ensuring ALL accidents and incidents are reported to a Health & Safety Officer at the Office.
 - Helping new employees, trainees, and visitors to understand the safety procedures and why they exist.
 - Informing the office immediately of any health and safety concerns.
 - Keeping the event facilities tidy to minimise the risk of any trips and falls.

COMPETITORS are responsible for themselves at ALL times and must observe the safe practices and the rules/instructions relating to their competition. In case of a fall of an athlete and/or horse at any time in the competition arena, in the practice arena, or elsewhere within the grounds of the event, the athlete must be checked by the event's medical service and the check recorded on your event medical check card before you are permitted to take part in the round in progress or in the next round or competition at the event (Article 224). The card must remain in your pocket and be presented to the gate steward or ground committee before continuing to compete. The horse must be cleared by the Veterinarian or President of the Ground Jury and one other official if the Veterinarian is not available, before the equine is permitted to take part in the next round or competition at the event (Article 224). Wairarapa Show Jumping Group complies with the ESNZ concussion policy. Riders who have a suspected concussion will be removed from the event. Riders who are concussed are often unaware of their symptoms and may want to continue riding. The Ground Jury at the event takes responsibility for the rider's wellbeing, assesses the rider and makes an informed choice about whether the rider should continue to ride or not – if any doubt the rider must be removed from the event as per the Blue Card process (outlined below). ESNZ's Blue Card process has been developed to keep riders safe and to support officials in their duty of care.

Blue Card process:

- Officials can exclude a rider from participating in a competition or entire event by issuing a Blue Card because the rider has received a serious injury, including concussion or suspected concussion.
- If a rider issued with a Blue Card at an event refuses to withdraw from the event, disciplinary action may be taken through the disciplinary process set out in the ESNZ general regulations.
- The Blue Card notice is logged on a rider's profile on ESNZ's database.
- A Blue Card means that a rider is stood down from all riding activities until clearance from a registered GP or registered medical specialist can be obtained.
- If a rider who has been issued with a Blue Card competes without first providing medical clearance, this may result in disciplinary action taken through the ESNZ disciplinary process set out in the ESNZ general regulations.
