



Dressage Masters Top 10 League 2023 – 2024

This competition is designed to promote dressage competition and participation for Masters Riders. The series provides an opportunity for riders to compete against peers at five different levels at all levels of events and competition regardless of whether riders compete locally, at Premier League events or nationally. The competition will be open to riders 50 years and over (see condition 5) and is run in five national divisions plus special awards.

Entry conditions align with the Gold Silver & Bronze Classifications at each level

National Section

1: Preliminary and Novice	Combination Classification Preliminary Bronze or Novice Bronze
2: Preliminary and Novice	Combination Classification Preliminary Silver, Preliminary Gold, Novice Silver or Novice Gold
3: Elementary to Advanced Medium	Combination Classification Elementary Bronze, Medium Bronze or Advanced Medium Bronze
4: Elementary to Advanced Medium	Combination Classification Elementary Silver, Medium Silver or Advanced Medium Silver
5: Elementary to Advanced Medium	Combination Classification Elementary Gold, Medium Gold or Advanced Medium Gold
6: Advanced and above	No classification

Special Awards

Newcomer (First year member)	Open to new ESNZ graded Dressage rider with no grading points in Dressage prior to 1 st April 2023
Owner /Horse Combo Award	Highest age horse/rider combined.
Partnership Award	Horse may not have earned grading points with any other rider at any time.

Eligibility

1. All participating horses must be registered and have an Annual Dressage Start for graded competitions.
2. Downgraded horses are eligible.
3. Bronze, Silver or Gold classification is at the date the entry is made on EvoEvents.
4. Riders must be full competitive members of the ESNZ
5. For Riders 50yrs & over (age from the beginning of the calendar year that the rider turns 50)

Conditions

1. Enter online at www.evoevents.co.nz no later than 1st November 2023
2. Horses may be entered in any level for which they are eligible as per the grading rules, but if a horse for instance is entered in Section 3, no points from any classes below Elementary will be accrued.
3. Competition runs from 1 August 2023 until 30th April 2024
4. Maximum of 10 scores to count from graded events on the official DNZ Calendar.
5. Riders may contest the league on more than one horse
6. Riders may only contest one National section per horse

7. Downgraded horses are eligible.
8. Participants must be annual competitive members of the ESNZ
9. Combo award eligibility: Rider date of birth must be recorded on the ESNZ database

Scoring

1. Awards points can be earned in graded competitions only
2. Points are accrued as a combination
3. Maximum of 10 scores to count from Graded events on the official DNZ Calendar
4. In the event of a tie, the combination with the highest average percentage from the top ten scores will be deemed the winner.
5. Points are awarded as follows

Rosettes will be awarded to the highest scoring horse in each ESNZ area. A rider's Area is determined by the ESNZ Area Boundaries, and not necessarily the Area Group to which they belong.

Gold Silver Bronze Categories 2023-24

- **Bronze eligibility % is 64% ALL LEVELS, Silver eligibility is 67% ALL LEVELS.**
- Riders may compete in their category when GSB is used, or ride in Gold (Open)
- Eight years eligibility calculated from 1st August annually
- Eligibility at the evening prior to the event
- Graded competition scores only to count - Freestyle scores are included .
- Small Tour and above is defined as Prix St Georges to Grand Prix Levels incl FEI Young Rider tests
