CONFERENCE REMITS 2023

Passed by Planning Forum to Conference for Ratification

Remit 1: Breeches

Amend CURRENT RULE/ARTICLE NUMBER: DRESS 479

Jodhpurs Breeches to be allowed being dark colours (black, brown, or grey)
RATIONALE: Allows entry into sport without purchasing specific competition wear, more comfortable for riders. More inclusive and flattering for those not comfortable in white due to body shape; More confidence for riders competing whilst menstruating. Not transparent when wet/riding in the rain.

As per the USEF Dressage Rules: 1.4 Breeches and Jodhpurs. White, light, or dark coloured breeches or jodhpurs are permitted in competition. Bright colours or patterns are not permitted. Contrast piping is allowed.

Remit 2: Penalty re Boots

ARTICLE NUMBER: 477 5.1

5.1: **Clarify** where it says any kind of boots are, under penalty of elimination, strictly forbidden.

Motion: Follow the FEI rule: – re-starting the test after allowing an assistant to remove the boots National rules: remove "elimination" and give a 2-point penalty

Remit 3: Fly Masks

5: Remit: Art 477 5.4

Fly masks are forbidden in competition but may be used when training and in warm-up. Elimination if used in competition.

5.4: Add fly masks are permitted when training or warming up. . Masks may not be attached to the bridle in any way.

Remits 4: Ear Hoods

Amend: CURRENT RULE/ARTICLE NUMBER: Article 477.3.6

REMIT Add to current wording:

Ear hoods may not be attached to the noseband. **RATIONALE:** To bring in line with FEI rules.

Remit 5: Whips

Addition: CURRENT RULE/ ARTICLE NUMBER: Article 478.1.3 Add: New wording -

For use of whips in Young Dressage Horses classes refer to Annex 7 clause 4

RATIONALE: Clarification

Remit 6: Dressage Rules for Administration ESNZ By Law 17

That there be no time limit for Finance Officer on Board owing to the on hands and very specific skill set required. **Note:** The current by-law permits two x three year terms only

NB: If passed this will require to ESNZ Board for approval



Remit 7: Neck Straps

The Planning Forum resolved that these remits be referred to conference as there was a tied vote Neck Straps: No Decision / Poll result: 14 For/14 against

Amend CURRENT RULE/ARTICLE NUMBER: 477 – Saddlery 8.1.2

7A: REMIT: Neck Strap allowed to be used in test above Novice (Level 2)

RATIONALE: Horses at higher levels can still be nervous. A neck strap would be a safety measure for riders who choose to ride with it.

7B: REMIT:

New wording: Neck straps are approved as a safety device for all levels in Nationals classes. A neck strap is a single plain strap fitted in one loop around the horse's neck, can only be used for safety purposes, cannot be used to stabilise the rider.

RATIONALE: Horses of any level can have moments of resistance or spooking, and easier for judges, riders, officials to remember if it's allowed at all levels.

7C : REMIT:

CURRENT RULE/ARTICLE NUMBER: CURRENT RULE/ARTICLE NUMBER: 477 – Saddlery 8.1.2 Amend For safety purpose only, neck straps to be allowed at all levels

The GSB subcommittee have factored into their decision from feedback from riders, OC and judges.

Silver category, given that the gap between Bronze and Gold deemed too wide and by upping the Bronze % to become a bronze/silver category you were losing the essence of the reasoning behind GSB Categories by combing B/S.

- * Upped Bronze to 64% for all Bronze levels.
- A) reduced confusion for riders as they moved up the grades.
- B) 63% was deemed too low, as a DNZ collective we are trying to raise the bar of Dressage across the board. Reflecting on Bronze scores across the country the ones that were participating on average well was sitting on the 64%, this was felt as attainable for Bronze as a whole.
- * Dropping the 'previously ridden levels' down a level in Bronze and Silver this change made those levels true newcomer levels.
- * Dropping the total scores to 10 or more 11 seemed to be confusing, 12 seems too many.
- * Raising the bar four years to eight years in sliver eliminates those riders that have ridden high level within this period. This was a very negative area for riders, as it allowed previously top level riders to be silver.



Gold to become an open level - those riders that wish not to ride in Bronze or Silver are eligible for Gold (Open). Riders can choose to ride out of Bronze/silver at an event where they are offered. They must enter this by close of enter, OC has the right to refuse them change after (pot hunters)

Silver to be 67% over all levels in silver.

A) reduced confusion for riders as they moved up the grades. B) it was felt that if a rider is consistently scoring 68% or higher at Silver they were ready to compete in Gold.

Directives for OC:

- * Strongly suggested that areas are to run GSB as merged classes and results extracted. Data from records across NZ highlight that areas or National events do not have more than 30 (sometimes even 20) horses in each level. They can be run as merged classes (whether its bronze and open, or all GSB) GSB results are extracted at end whether for Champion/Reserve or rosettes in individual classes. Areas are to stipulate on schedule and programme how it is to be presented.
- * It was felt that riders have access to a simple table so they can record their own scores (like the old ESNZ Horse rego booklets), that way they can be accountable themselves for what they enter and don't rely on EE or the event management

It is also felt by the GSB Sub Committee that there should be an Congratulatory factor for those riders that upgrade within the GSB system - in way of a medal (like the old rider medal system from a few years ago, where riders could pin the medal onto their lapels of their jackets) or rosettes. This recognition of achievement was felt necessary to those newcomers across all grades within our sport.



Gold Silver Bronze Categories 2022-23

- Eligibility at the evening prior to the event
- Small Tour and above is defined as Prix St Georges to Grand Prix Levels
- Riders may compete in their category when GSB is used, or ride in Gold (open)
- Freestyle scores are no longer excluded.
- Bronze eligibility % is 64% ALL LEVELS, Silver eligibility is 67% ALL LEVELS.
- Areas are suggested to run merged classes and GSB results extracted.


