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## Land Rover Jumping Challenge Series

### Competition Conditions

Teams of 4 combinations, which must include one pony combination. This series is based on results from Jumping and Show Hunter, and requires teams to compete in SJ and SH. Refer to Prizes and Points Calculation below for further detail on scoring.

Teams organise and register themselves and may include combinations from any or several ESNZ areas within the team. All members and horses/ponies must have current ESNZ membership, Equine registration, and Jumping Discipline Annual start.

**Eligible pony combinations** to be competing at 1.00m or less for this series. Once they compete above 1m in this season any further scores will no longer count towards the Land Rover Jumping Challenge team score. Combinations must not have competed above 1.05m in previous season.

**Eligible horse combinations** to be competing at 1.10m or less for this series. Once they compete above 1.10m any further scores will no longer count towards the team score. Combinations must not have competed above 1.15m in previous season.

Combinations and teams remain the same throughout the competition, no swapping during the season.

Each combination in the team must have a minimum of 3 starts towards the Land Rover Jumping Challenge team score.

### Entries:

**Entry Fee** \$25 per combination to be paid at time of entry.

Entries will open on 31 August and remain open unless numbers become too large, at which point ESNZ Jumping reserves the right to close entries.

Teams will be eligible for points from qualifying events from the time the team entry is completed, including payment of entry fee. One person to enter the team.

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### Organising Committees

20 ESNZ Areas – each area to host one competition per area within a current show from the Official Dates Calendar.

This show to be promoted as “hosting the Land Rover Jumping Challenge”.



No special classes required, and no results calculation required. All results tracking will be managed by ESNZ. It is intended that classes will already be part of the show schedule.

The show to offer (for each of Show Hunter and Jumping):

- 2 pony classes per day for two-day show (total 4 classes) in the range of 80cm – 1.00m
- 2 horse classes per day for two-day show (total 4 classes) in the range of 90cm – 1.10m

**Excludes classes run under Art 238 1.1 (A1)**

The series will run between 1<sup>st</sup> October 2022 and 26<sup>th</sup> March 2023.

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### **Sponsor Hosting**

Land Rover wish to connect with the community as much as possible through this series and may attend your show, along with displaying Land Rover vehicles. Once dates are confirmed your committee will be advised if Land Rover will be attending and contact details.

Where possible, the team combinations should be identified in programmes/online (consider the Land Rover logo by their name) to create interest at shows and allow the public to follow this competition. Ongoing results will be made available throughout the competition for announcing and generating public interest.

Where Land Rover representatives are present, riders should be encouraged to connect with them. Consider a photo with car/riders.

Land Rover logo and information for schedules and promotion will be provided.

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### **Prizes**

The winning team for the series to receive \$1,000 prize money, rugs and rosettes.

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### **Points Calculation for Series**

The winning team will be that with the best score at the end of the series based on:

- Best 8 Show Hunter scores (pony or horse)
- Best 8 Pony Jumping scores
- Best 20 Horse Jumping scores

Jumping scores to be based on clear rounds, where a clear round with 0 faults is the best score and will receive scoring points. Clear round points will be awarded for the first round in the competition. In addition, riders with a clear round that get placed in the class will receive extra points from 1<sup>st</sup> – 10<sup>th</sup> placings.

Show Hunter scores of 66% or higher will receive scoring points. In addition, riders with a score of 66% and above that get placed in the class will receive extra points.

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<b><u>Points:</u></b>
Clear round (first round), or 66% and above in SH = 1 point
<b>Additional Points:</b>
<b>Those with a clear round or 66% and above in SH</b> , will then receive additional points for placings against other people in the competition in their class. E.g. If rider is placed 2 <sup>nd</sup> in the class but is the highest placed rider in the LR Jumping Challenge within that class they will be awarded 10 points for highest placed LRJC rider. 2 <sup>nd</sup> highest place LRJC rider will receive 9 points etc. This will continue down to 10 <sup>th</sup> place within the class.
Placings in class: 1 <sup>st</sup> = 10 points, 2 <sup>nd</sup> = 9 points, 3 <sup>rd</sup> = 8 points, 4 <sup>th</sup> = 7 points, 5 <sup>th</sup> = 6 points, 6 <sup>th</sup> = 5 points, 7 <sup>th</sup> = 4 points, 8 <sup>th</sup> = 3 points, 9 <sup>th</sup> = 2 points, 10 <sup>th</sup> = 1 point.

Scores are taken only from classes that are qualifying rounds for the Land Rover Jumping Teams Challenge, as advertised within the Show Schedule.

Teams will not receive a score (and will be ruled no longer eligible) at the end of the series if they do not have:

- 8 SH scores (pony or horse)
- 8 Pony SJ scores
- 20 Horse SJ scores

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**Examples of team ideas, you can make up your own:**

1 pony competing SJ and SH, 2 horses competing SJ, 1 horse competing SH. Can come from different geographical areas (e.g., a group of friends)

1 pony competing SJ, 2 horses competing SJ and some SH, 1 horse competing SH. (Could be from same or neighbouring areas.)

1 pony competing SJ, 1 horse competing SJ and some SH, 1 horse competing SJ, 1 horse competing SH. (Could be from anywhere in NZ, a group of friends, or could be from same area)
