#### Matters arising from previous minutes:

1. Grading points will not now be recorded – updated by Betty Brown to the floor. This will occur when the new ESNZ database comes into action. Riders happy about this.

#### **General Business**

1. **ISES taper gauge** - Jody addressed the meeting on the ISES taper gauge which is designed to measure and standardise the tightness of nose bands. This gauge was shown to the meeting. It was suggested that these be provided to stewards to trial at Nationals (with no penalties given to riders). Proposed that a remit be considered to put forward to DNZ Planning Meeting regarding its introduction. Some concerns and discussions re the ease of use, need for them, and how they work with a flash / drop noseband.
2. **Competition financials** - Discussion took place on a document prepared by Alicia and Betty Brown detailing the costs of running competitions and the profitability of shows. This document looked at the future of the sport and detailed costs of paying all volunteers the minimum wage. If this was the case, then entry fees would need to be \$50 per class to break even. Stakeholders need to be looked after. Area groups are mostly running these shows at a loss and costing over 500 hours in volunteer time. It was suggested we have an incentive for volunteers in the form of \$50 discount if a rider volunteers time. Some jobs could be done by riders and not the OC, e.g. sponsor invitations etc. New Health and Safety requirements added costs to OC's. No real solutions, but good to have a discussion regarding the future of the sport and our responsibilities financially and also to our volunteer pool.
3. **Nationals at Taupo** - Discussion was held on DNZ decision to move Nationals back to Taupo. The following are points from that discussion:

- Debbie Barke, as representative of NEC, Taupo, addressed the meeting and gave information on the new facilities at Taupo and progress to date. NEC are appointing a new part time Manager to manage the new facility. Staff presently working hard to get the indoor finished and paying for itself within 2-3 years. Debbie agreed that yards are getting tired but this was mainly due to staff working hard to get the indoor finished.
- Wendy Hamerton attending Taupo during Dressage Waikato Championships to see progress and feasibility.
- It is believed by riders that Taupo has sufficient area in the indoor for corporate and indoor entertaining.
- Alicia asked riders for a show of hands as to how many wanted Taupo. Most of the room were in favour. It was agreed that with this meeting being held in Auckland that it would be necessary to check with riders “south of Taupo” for their opinion.
- Alicia asked what was it they liked about Taupo - great indoor with good surface, good outdoor arenas, more arenas available, all monies go back to ESNZ, could accommodate more horses.
- Manfield - \$25,000 to hire venue, don't like abattoir, car racing and surfaces.
- Riders thought Manfield indoor received very little support during the day for tradestands.
- Debbie said Taupo will have similar space to Manfield for tradestands.
- Alicia asked the hypothetical question if it was more expensive at Taupo, would riders still want to go there over Manfield. Riders thought it would not be more expensive. No figures provided to discuss.
- Alicia conveyed that DNZ trying to do the right thing but need to have some answers from Taupo as to charges and completion of some areas.
- It was proposed that Debbie have discussions with Wendy to resolve issues surrounding moving the Nationals back to Taupo.

#### 4. **Format of Nationals**

- Could Nationals be over 3 days instead of 5? CDI might be a factor.
- Alicia to suggest to DNZ that they form a subcommittee to look into this.

5. **Mare identification** – Kiernyn Walton raised the issue of safety when riding a mare in competition. Apparently a red ribbon on a mare's tail is considered decorative and not permissible within the rules. In Australia the tag is removed before going into the arena. It was felt that as mares were, in some cases, as dangerous to other horses as stallions, then there should be some way of identifying them. Suggestion - red for a kicker and green for a green horse.

6. **Arena familiarisation** – Peter Barke would like to see riders permitted to do more than just walk during arena familiarisation. He will submit a remit regarding this to try to get this changed. There was some discussion on the subject. OC's have to manage riders and also harrowing (and watering) of the arena if time permits. Safety needs to be a priority. Not to be used as a schooling session. Riders seemed happy to pay for a warmup round - \$10 was suggested, limited to 3 riders. Needs to have someone nominated to supervise the group. Arenas need to be same as competition time, e.g. if using judges boxes, then boxes need to be open with windows up.
