Welcome to the North Island Secondary Schools Equestrian Championship 2024 brought to you by Equestrian Sports New Zealand and the New Zealand Pony Club Association.

Please read the general conditions before you enter. It is each competitor's responsibility to know the rules and conditions of the event. This year we will be holding a session on Tuesday evening to discuss and answer questions relating to the Jumping and Show Hunter rules. You may bring along any equipment for checking.

The event has been timetabled on the basis that students can compete in all disciplines and stay for four days of competition. There is something for riders of all abilities. Gather your school team mates and give CTR a go, this will be a great warm up event before the jumping and dressage competitions get underway on the following days.

Please carefully check the timetable of the events before you make your entries, keeping in mind the welfare of the horse at all times.

Special Conditions

This event is governed by the ESNZ General Regulations and relevant policies and codes and where applicable discipline sport rules and bylaws. All of these can be accessed via the

The Organising Committee may, at their absolute discretion, decline to receive any entry, or return any fee without being required to give any reason or being liable for any compensation.

The Organising Committee in consultation with the President of the Ground Jury and/or Technical Delegate reserve the right: to cancel any class or event, to divide any class, to alter advertised times, to transfer competitors between sections of competition.

Responsible Adults - All riders must have an adult on the grounds who is responsible for them. This is not the function of the team manager. The ratio of riders to adults in each school team must not exceed 4:1 at any time. It is the responsibility of the school to ensure this is adhered to.

Duties - To assist with the running of the show all schools will need to volunteer for duties. Each rider in the team will need to volunteer for one job. There will be a list of duties on EvoEvents after the close of entries and each rider needs to volunteer for one duty. If you haven't volunteered by the 22nd August then you will be allocated a duty and this may be allocated at a time that you are competing. The duty must be completed by the school and you can share the duty around amongst your school as the team manager sees fit. We will publish a list of the duties. Please ensure that as a school you have enough adult supporters to attend to the duties.

Cancellation - In the unlikely event cancellation should be required an email will be sent to all entrants. This will also be posted on ESNZ Facebook and Instagram.

All classes will be run in draw order.

Eligibility

- To be eligible to participate in this event you must be a current full, child or introductory member of ESNZ or a current member of NZPCA – if not a current member of either organisation, then you must become a casual member for the event and this is payable with your entries.

Student Eligibility

- A student eligible to compete in National and Island secondary school events must:
- be enrolled as a bona fide (Year 7 or above) student at the school of representation and studying at least 80% of a programme that is part of the timetable provided by the school for at least four weeks immediately prior to the event.
- have a satisfactory attendance record at the school. The final decision will be at the principal's discretion.
- be under 19 years of age at the first of January in the year of the competition unless specified otherwise for a particular competition.
- The school must be prepared to authenticate a student's birth date. Organising committees may require validation by a birth certificate or passport.
- All teams and individuals participating in National or Island events must be declared at the date prescribed by the sanctioned sporting body.
- **This event is also open to year 7 and 8 students to compete individually and as part of a year 7 & 8 team, however, if event capacity is over subscribed, year 7 and year 8 entries will not be accepted. This will be notified at close of entries.**

Dogs - dogs are permitted onsite but must adhere to National Equestrian Centre rules around which areas and must also be on a lead at ALL times.

Entries - All competitors should enter as individuals, entries via www.evoevents.co.nz

Please ensure your school and year level are entered in your My Account on EvoEvents.

A school contact email must be supplied by all entrants to confirm they are endorsed by the school. All riders from the same school are considered to be in that school team.

Composite Teams - No composite teams are allowed.

Teams - If a rider has two horses, then each is treated as a separate combination for point scoring and only one may count for the school points. When schools do not have a team, riders compete as individuals. Schools with more than 8 competitors will be asked to split their teams relatively evenly with no team having less than 3 riders.

Dress - School Team uniform for all events.

Equines - If you are not camping onsite then you will need to nominate someone to be responsible for your equine when you aren't onsite. All equines must have a tag on at all times when they are in their yards or stables. This must display the equines name, the person responsible and their phone number.

Maximum Classes - Horses/Ponies can compete in a maximum of three classes on any one day. A Horse/Pony may only compete in one level in Dressage, Jumping and Arena eventing. Timetable is such that combination could compete in all disciplines offered. If the final timetable means that you will be competing in more than three classes in a day you may be asked to change your entries.

Maximum Equines - Riders are limited to competing a maximum of two equines at the event, should numbers permit.

Online Entries - Entries online at EvoEvents and payments made through PoLi. By entering online, you are making an agreement with the Organising Committee and all fees are due. Entries not fully paid at time of entry will not be accepted but will be held until payment is received and then accepted into the event provided the event has not closed entries. Late entry fees will apply if payment is received after close of entries.

Scratchings - All scratchings are to be notified immediately via EvoEvents.

Refunds - Riders scratching from the event 48 hours before start of competition (before 8.00am Saturday 31 August 2024) will be entitled to a 100% refund of entry fees, less EvoEvents Online Booking fees and administration fee, on presentation of a veterinary or medical certificate.

NEC Taupō Portacabins are not currently available to competitors.

Powered Sites - There are very limited powered sites available which will be allocated on a first come first served basis. Please don't book a rental caravan that needs power without confirmation that you have been allocated a site.

Horse Accommodation Allocation - Stables and covered yards will be allocated on a first in, first paid basis. Only those with lease yards at NECs will take preference.

Camping - Camping on grounds is not compulsory however students are strongly encouraged to participate in all evening activities.

Scoring

Points are awarded per placing. Each discipline level will have the same amount of points available to add to the team score. As CTR and Arena Eventing only have one class per level, 3x the amount of points will be awarded than that of the other classes. For example

Dressage and Jumping- Each class is allocated 35 placings to gain points, 1st is awarded 35 points, 35th is awarded 1 point, 36th is awarded zero points.

CTR and Arena eventing- 1st place is awarded 105 points, 2nd place 102 points, 35th place is awarded 3 points 36th is awarded zero points.

Awards

Individual Awards

1st to 6th placing will be awarded in each class/round

1st to 6th placing will be awarded in each level/height

Team Discipline Awards

1st to 3rd in each discipline – Dressage, Arena Eventing, CTR, Jumping & Show Hunter.

Points for placings will be allocated for each class. For Dressage and Jumping that have 3 classes at each level these are added together for each rider to give total points for the level. For CTR and Arena Eventing the class points directly make the total level points. If you have more than one horse in a team then the highest eligible points will count (e.g. you can't count 2 lots of individual points from one rider). Top 3 individual level scores from each team will count towards the overall discipline team score.

Championship Team

1st to 6th overall team – cross discipline award.

The overall team score is the scores of each team discipline award added together.

Opportunities may be available for extra team points to be won at evening activities TBC.

Year 7 & 8 Team Championship

1st to 3rd year 7 & 8 team – cross discipline award. Minimum of 3 in a team.

The scores are calculated by taking the top 2 scores from each discipline and adding them together. If a rider has more than one horse in a team then the highest eligible points will count (e.g. you can't count 2 lots of individual points from one rider). The 2nd horse doesn't count towards the minimum rider numbers in a team.

Sportsmanship award

The Sportsmanship award will be awarded to one team who display good sportsmanship throughout things such as:

- Supporting their teammates in the warmup or as a cheer squad whilst their teammates are competing
- Helping ring set up before the show starts/during & after
- Helping keep the grounds clean, picking up rubbish or manure
- Helping pick up rails when they fall during the show and with changing jump heights

To help us judge this it is suggested all team member, parents, coaches & support crew where their school colours/uniforms

NB, Only results from years 9-13 students will be eligible for the team discipline awards and overall championship team award. There is a separate overall team championship for year 7 & 8 students.

CTR is a timed event with individuals given start times approximately five minutes apart.

You will be given an optimum time (eg 90 minutes) to complete the 10km course. We send out 2-3 riders at one time and do our best to send team members together where possible.

Faults are for being too fast (two time faults for every minute or part thereof under), too slow (one time fault for every minute or part there of over) and also taken from heart rates – which are recorded when they cross the finish line and again at the final vet check (not more than 30 minutes after finishing).

Dressage Conditions

- ESNZ Membership
 - Non Graded classes: Full Member/Child Member/Introductory Member/Casual Member/NZPCA Riding Member
 - ESNZ Horse Registration: Not required for this competition.
- Combinations can only ride at **one level**
- Downgraded horses and ponies are eligible.
- Introductory (Level 0): Horses / ponies may not have more than 30 Level 1 points unless the rider has never earned any grading points in ESNZ Dressage on any horse or pony.
- Preliminary (Level 1): Horses / ponies may not have more than 30 Level 2 points unless the rider has never earned any grading points in ESNZ Dressage on any horse or pony
- Novice (Level 2) Horses / ponies may not have more than 30 Level 3 points unless the rider has never earned any grading points Level 1 or above in ESNZ Dressage on any horse or pony.
- Elementary (Level 3): Open to all horses/ponies/riders

- In the interests of creating a fair competition the Arena Eventing Competition does not allow Cross Country watches to be worn
- Horse and pony classes may be combined at discretion of organisers.

Jumping Conditions

- **ESNZ Membership**
 - Full Member/Child Member/Introductory Member/Casual Member/NZPCA Riding Member
 - ESNZ Horse Registration – Not Required for intro classes, other classes see levies below
- **Jumping Discipline Levies**
 - \$7 per show in addition to the entry fee
 - Pony 80cm-90cm and Pony 90cm-1.00m – Unregistered ponies pay an ESNZ Casual fee of \$5.15 and an ESNZ jumping flexi start of \$25. on top of entry fee.
 - Horses 90cm-1.00m and 1.00m-1.05m , – Unregistered horses pay an ESNZ Casual fee of \$5.15 and an ESNZ jumping flexi start of \$25 on top of entry fee.
- Combinations can only compete in one level
- A single entry into a jumping height is for three rounds of jumping at the same height, one round of which is Show Hunter. This round will be judged as per ESNZ Show Hunter rules.
- Horse and pony classes may be combined at discretion of organisers.
- There will be no changes of level accepted after 4pm Monday 2nd September except in extenuating circumstances with the permission of the appropriate official.
