Takapoto has some specific conditions set by the venue that are non-negotiable. These are listed in the Official Schedule

Competitors may be asked to leave the grounds if these are not adhered to, either by them or any associated party (whether ESNZ Members or not). Please ensure that you make everyone staying with or associated with you on the grounds is aware of them.

Please also keep in mind that this event will be attended by many spectators, fans, and operations crew that are unfamiliar with Dressage. We are keen to make a good impression, therefore request that all participants are aware of the ESNZ Code of Conduct and expected behaviour.

If you leave the venue at any time during the event at any time, please ensure that contact details on your horse are updated to a person onsite, in the case of emergency. This person must also be informed they are in charge and responsible of your horse. Please complete the OFF SITE form at the office so the OC and stewards we are aware that you are not on site.

Takapoto Rules

No horses on grounds before 9am Thursday. No riding on grounds before 12.00 Thursday for non-FEI CDI Horses (FEI CDI riders will receive an additional email).

Riding is restricted to nominated areas only (please see attached maps).

NO DOGS – NO EXCEPTIONS (service dogs WITH DOCUMENTATION ARE exempt but must be cleared by OC before entering grounds).

No truck parties.

No alcohol to be brought from stable area OR PUBLIC PARKING AREA into competition and/or bar area.

The bar area is a licenced premise, and as such reserves the right to refuse service or close should Management deem necessary.

Smoking is restricted to a smoking area behind the Riders Bar only.

The location of Venue is rural and adjacent to a lake, naturally exposing hazards such as animals, troughs, and open waterways. The Venue **STRONGLY** recommends that parents and/or guardians are especially vigilant of the whereabouts of their children at all times.

All guests are required to adhere to the Venue's Health and Safety policies and to remain within the specified Event area at all times. Please see attached Venue map.

Arrival at Venue

Competitors are recommended to enter the venue via Maungatautari Road, off State Highway 1. Keep going onto Plantation Road, then turn left onto Oreipunga Road. Around 500m down this road, Finlay Road is on left.

Traffic lights will be operational on Finlay Road on most days (especially Thursday and Sunday for arrival/departure). Please always go slowly down Finlay Road and stay well to your side of the road as does quite narrow.

Truck entrance (and camping entrance) is second gate (deer fenced gate). Public day parking is first gate.

Event Office and Start time of Event

The official start time of the event is 9am Thursday. This is the start time for the period of jurisdiction for all Equestrian Sport New Zealand (ESNZ) General Regulations and ESNZ Dressage rules. Please note Dressage NZ rule 420-430 prohibited gear is not allowed from the time of arrival at the event.

Sunday's classes may have some rescheduling on Saturday evening to allow us to finish earlier. Please keep an eye on Equestrian Entries, your emails and text – we will notify you if we are doing a reallocation of times.

Health and Safety

You all should have read the Health and Safety Disclaimer on Equestrian Entries when entering.

Please make sure your grooms and supporters are aware of everything covered in it.

Copies of this Disclaimer and the Takapoto H&S Policy will be displayed on the notice board. If you would like a copy please ask at the office.

We also have other rules in the schedule that you and other people with you need to be aware of. We have included a copy of these in this email, so please ensure everyone is aware – failure to read these is not an excuse.

Riders/Horses must stay within the designated competition and warm up areas (within sight of the stewards) at all times. This is for your own safety.

There is to be no jumping of any jumps whilst you are on the grounds.

All helmets must be yellow tagged as approved.

Speed limit onsite *is 5kmph*. Vehicles including motorcycles must abide by normal road rules, which means the driver must have a valid licence. When riding motorcycles, bicycles, or horses an appropriate safety helmet must be worn.

Grooms, coaches, family, friends and supporters are to stay out of the warmup areas (standing to the sides only) and should use earphones/ head sets.

Stabling and Parking

Please do not move horse from your allocated stable unless it is unsafe. If there is an issue with your stable, please notify the OC / Stable Steward as soon as possible so any issue can be rectified.

If you have to change you must make an official request at the office, after discussion with the Stable Steward

Notices detailing the Stabling Stewards, Vet and Farriers contact numbers, will be posted in various places around the stabling area.

Remove all hay and manure and place in allocated manure bins. Please put all other rubbish in the bins provided.

Report any breakages to the office. Fines may be invoiced for any breakage not reported.

Horse/pony ESNZ identification numbers must be worn on both sides of the horse at all times when riding, and identification tags with horses name and your contact details must be on horses/ponies at all other times.

Please park / set up camp as close together as possible to make room for everyone. The Stewards or Organising Committee reserve the right to ask you to move.

No horses are to be tied to trucks AT ANY TIME.

Parking for non-competitors, including supporters is noted on that attached map. No cars are to be parked amongst the trucks.

All FEI tests run during this event will be the 2023 version as per www.fei.org - FEI website.

Equestrian Entries Profile and Commentators notes

Please ensure that you update your Equestrian Entries profile before you get to the grounds, we have an offshore commentator voicing the livestream, and commentators will be onsite and announcing during the day. This information may also be used in Facebook updates on results.

Music files

Music should already be uploaded to Evo Events before your arrival. If you have issues, or would like to check your music, please check in with Terry and Steph from Your Sound & Lighting at the event to check your music.

If you are unable to upload or email, musical CD's (or flash drives) need to be dropped off at the Musical office next to the Fiordland Discovery Premier Arena on Thursday. **No music will be accepted after 5.00pm Thursday.**

Arena Familiarisation and Schooling

All warmup areas will be open for schooling from 12.00 – 3.30pm Thursday. Riders must not enter the competition areas / arenas without express approval of an Official Steward.

Please be mindful of not abusing this opportunity. Please ensure you have assistance wherever possible to pick up manure from the arenas and walkways during this time.

Warmup areas will be closed at 3.30pm and reopened with the competition arenas for Familiarisation at walk from 4.00-4.45pm.

Warmup arenas

Riders must report to the Grass Warmup arena manager monitor on arrival. The Grass warmup arena may be moved during the show if the ground cuts up excessively – announcements will be made if this is the case.

Riders will be notified when they are able to move through the Bates Saddles Warmup arena. It is envisaged that riders will have at least 16 minutes in the Bates Saddles arena.

Riders will be called through to the Final Warmup arena. It is envisaged that riders will have around 16 minutes in this arena before moving through to complete their tests.

Riders wanting to school horses outside of their test times must report to the Grass warmup arena steward. Riders will only be permitted into the Bates Warmup arena if the Show Stewards deem that there is space, and it will not impact on other riders.

Please respect this – and it may be a good idea to discuss timings with the Show stewards BEFORE getting on your horse.

There is a strict grooming schedule built into the show timetable where tractors and groomers will be operating. Riders will be moved through to their next arena as soon as this is completed – you may have more time in the Bates Warmup arena and less time in the Final Warmup area

Fiordland Discovery Premier Arena Rule 486.3

The Fiordland Discovery Premier will be running as per 486.3 – where the rider starts from inside the arena. One minute in the arena is allowed and when the judge rings the bell, you present down the centre line.

Upon entering the arena area, a marshal will let you directly into the arena, from which you will present to the judge and start your test as normal.

Calling of tests

No Tests in the Fiordland Discovery Premier Arena may be commanded.

No FEI tests may be called.

For any rider wishes to have a caller in the Quin Buildings Direct, Redback Equine or Jamarqui Equestrian arenas (2, 3, or 4), we request that the caller must report to the arena steward in the final warmup before entering the arena area. Callers must exit by the closest gate after the test (not over or through the rail fence surrounding the arena, or through the warmup area).

The arena steward will advise how (which route to take) and when the caller may enter the arena space and where the caller may stand.

Sunday Final classes

All Elementary and Medium horses will progress through to the final class on Sunday.

Preliminary and Novice rides will be drawn into either the Major Final or Consolation Final depending on their rankings from the tests on Friday and Saturday.

Ranking is based on the total percentage score after the classes on Friday and Saturday.

Riders do not need to confirm acceptance into the final class – this is a change from the Official Schedule – all riders will get a start in either a Final or Consolation class.

If riders do not want to start in the final class, please scratch as early as possible at the Show Office

Riders are requested to be present or notify the event office of a stand in (in exceptional circumstances only). Failure to do so may result in Prizemoney being retained.

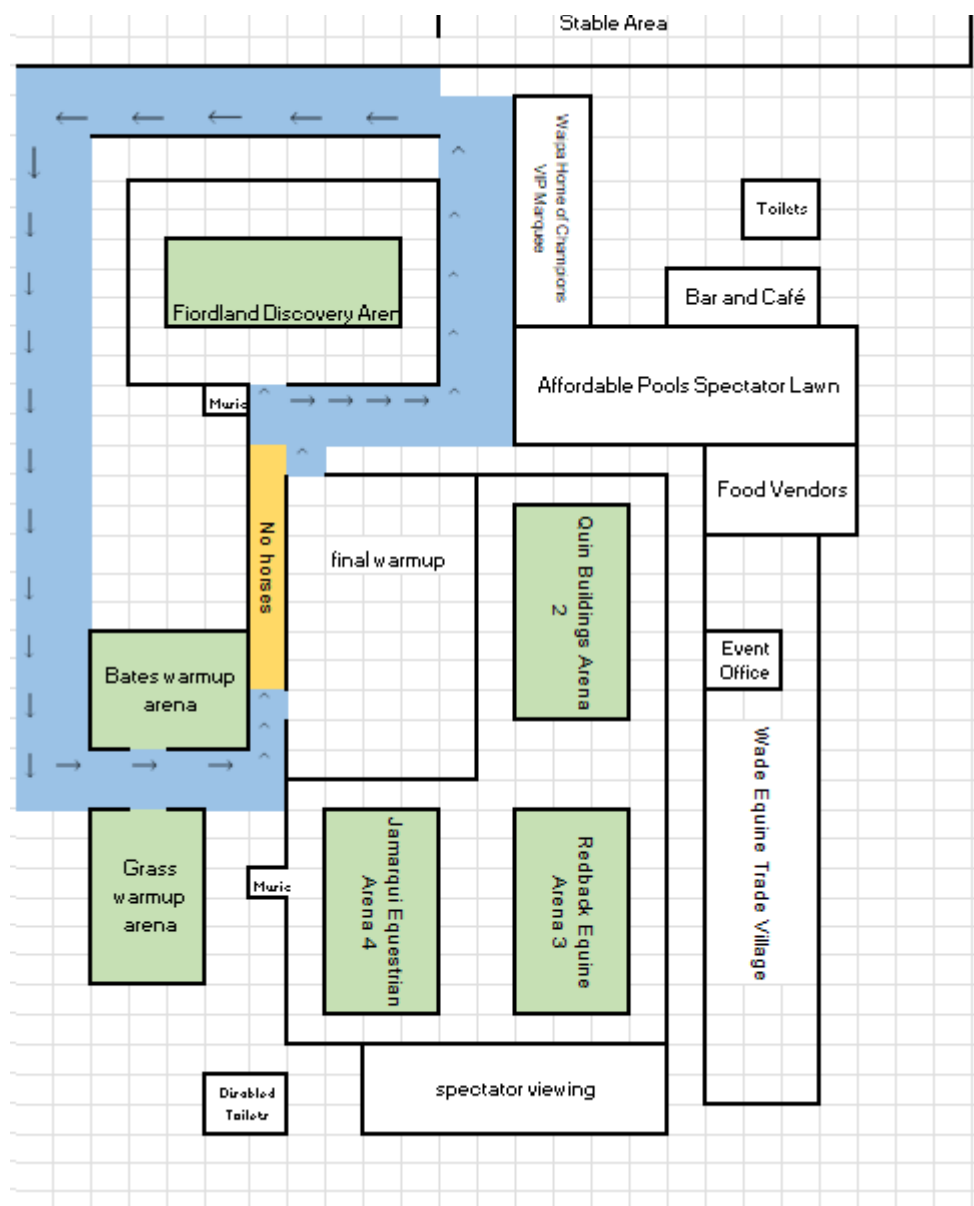
Site map of Arenas

Please note horse direction into the grass warmup and Bates Saddles Warmup arena (following arrows)

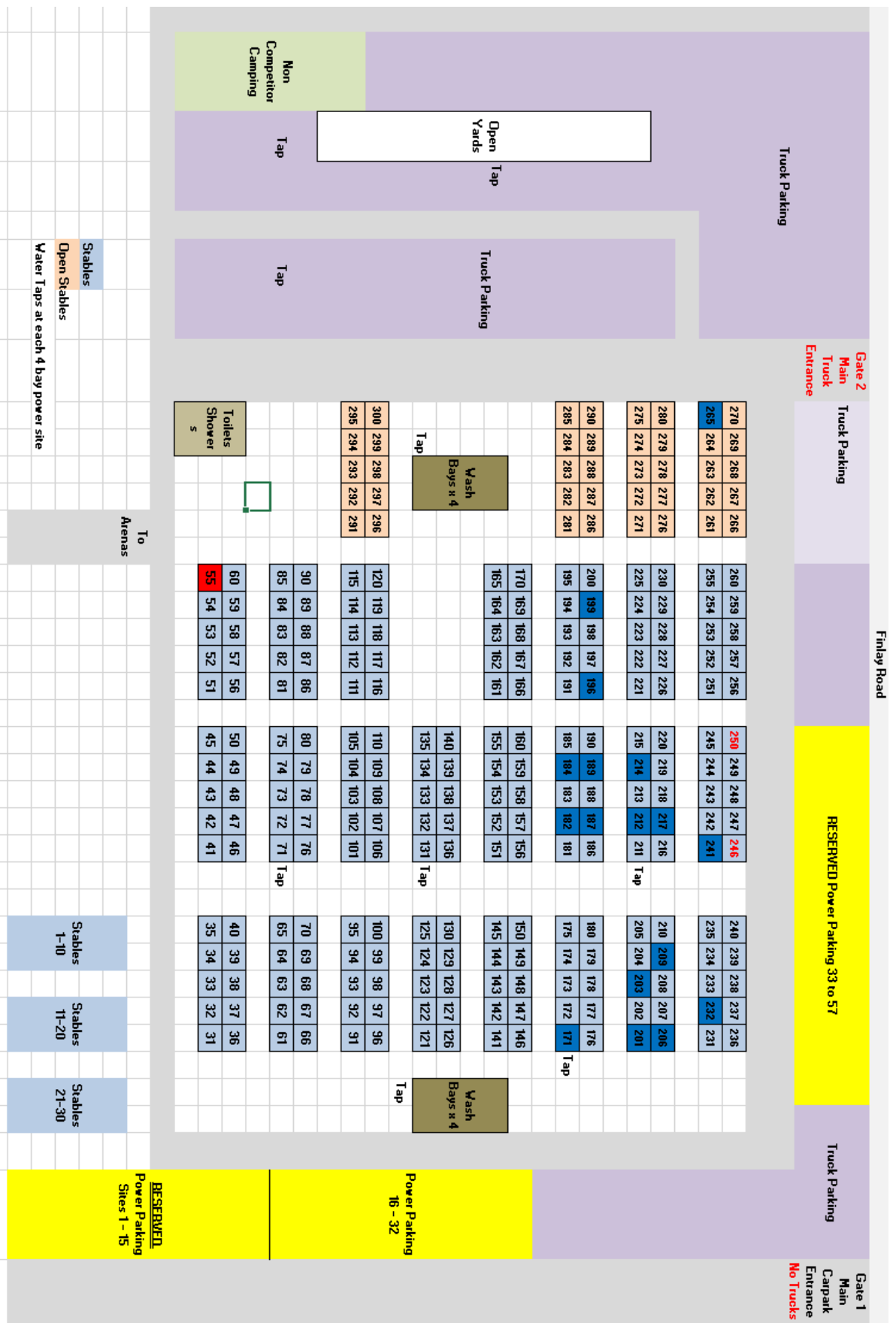
Riders head down the gravel driveway on the lake side of the property, leading to the warmup arenas.

Following tests, riders will exit past the Fjordland Discovery Premier Arena – please be mindful of competitors in this arena when exiting.

There is one gate into the final warmup area, and one gate to leave that surface (after your test or heading to the Fjordland Arena). These gates are monitored by volunteers. Please do not open any other gates for horse use.
