- 9. CLOSE OF ENTRIES: Tuesday 13th September, thereafter LATE.
- 10. LATE ENTRIES: \$20 late fee for horses not entered in show. Will start first in the class where class is drawn according to ESNZ rules. All class changes must be done by 5pm the day before.
- 11. PAYMENT: Payment is with entry by POLI pay or credit card on EvoEvents at the time of finalising entry. Please direct any questions to the Show Secretary. Direct credit payment for non-finalised entries to Rotorua SJ Group 03-1552-0118642-000. Payment must be received by Tuesday 13th September or entries are LATE.
- 12. SCRATCHINGS: no refund on admin fee or late entry fee, class and all other fees including stabling are refunded in full up until Tuesday 12th September. Contact Karen Potter <u>243matai@gmail.com</u>. No refunds for scratching or unused yards without a vet or medical certificate after this time. Class changes and late entries allowed.

- 13. ESNZ LEVYS: as per attached table.
- 14. SHOW/ADMIN LEVY: \$25 per horse.
- 15. MEDIC FEE: \$20 per rider
- 16. NEC FACILITY FEE: \$48 per horse.
- 17. YARDING: Open yards \$36 per horse for the show; Covered yards/Stable block \$78 per horse for the show. Paddocks \$36 per horse for the show (minimum 2 horses per paddock). Yard enquiries to Mikayla Herbert on 027 775 0849. Please note on entry if you own lease yards and the number owned. Please note at time of entry if a show/series sponsor. There is limited covered yards available. Horses/Ponies will be allocated on the following basis.
 - NEC lease yard holders
 - Sponsors
 - Horses of riders competing at Grand Prix level
 - Horses of riders that compete at 1.25m and above, attending all 3 days of the show
 - Riders competing on all three days
 - Covered yards and lease yards will not be available to horses not competing in scheduled classes.
 - The organizing committee reserves the right to allocate outside these priorities as they see fit.
- 18. NOTE:

NEC Taupo H&S policy specifically states that horses must not be left unattended whilst tied up to trucks or floats at any time. Accordingly, a row of day yards will be allocated for the use of riders who are not staying on the grounds and who have not therefore booked yards.

HEALTH & SAFETY POLICY

Cambridge Grains Spring Show, run by Rotorua Show Jumping Group (RSJG), is committed to providing and maintaining a safe and healthy event for all staff, and to providing the information, training and supervision needed to achieve this. We will take all practicable steps by:

- Providing a safe event, safe equipment, and proper materials.
- Identifying and monitoring hazards and using the hazard management hierarchy of *eliminate, isolate, or minimise.*
- Insisting upon establishment of safe methods and best practices.
- Complying with all H&S legislation, regulations, and codes of practice. **NOTE:** NEC H&S policy specifically states that horses must not be tied up to trucks or floats at any time.

We will take responsibility for health and safety procedures, however, **ALL PEOPLE ON THIS SITE** need to be aware of their responsibilities and comply with the event's health and safety policy. **EVERY PERSON** involved in Ray White Spring Show is encouraged to play a vital and responsible role in maintaining a safe and healthy event through:

- Being involved in the event health and safety system.
- Following correct procedures.
- Ensuring safe and proper use of equipment.
- Wearing protective clothing and equipment as and when required.
- Reporting any pain or discomfort as soon as possible.
- Ensuring ALL accidents and incidents are reported to the Health & Safety Officer at the Office.
- Helping new employees, trainees, and visitors to understand the safety procedures and why they exist.
- Informing the office immediately of any health and safety concerns.
- Keeping the event facilities tidy to minimize the risk of any trips and falls.

COMPETITORS are responsible for themselves at <u>ALL</u> times and must observe the safe practices and the rules/instructions relating to their competition.

In case of a fall of an athlete and/or horse at any time in the competition arena, in the practice arena, or elsewhere within the grounds of the event, the athlete must be checked by the event's medical service and the check recorded on your event medical check card before you are permitted to take part in the round in progress or in the next round or competition at the event (Article 224). The card must remain in your pocket and be presented to the gate steward or ground committee before continuing to compete. The horse must be cleared by the Veterinarian or President of the Ground Jury and one other official if the Veterinarian is not available, before the equine is permitted to take part in the next round or competition at the event (Article 224).

Cambridge Grains Spring Show complies with the ESNZ concussion policy. Riders who have a suspected concussion will be **removed from the event.** Riders who are concussed are often unaware of their symptoms and may want to continue riding. The Ground Jury at the event takes responsibility for the rider's wellbeing, assesses the rider and makes an informed choice about whether the rider should continue to ride or not – if any doubt the rider must be removed from the event as per the **Blue Card process** (outlined below). ESNZ's Blue Card process has been developed to keep riders safe and to support officials in their duty of care.

Blue Card process:

- Officials can exclude a rider from participating in a competition or entire event by issuing a Blue Card because the rider has received a serious injury, including concussion or suspected concussion.
- If a rider issued with a Blue Card at an event refuses to withdraw from the event, disciplinary action may be taken through the disciplinary process set out in the ESNZ general regulations.
- The Blue Card notice is logged on a rider's profile on ESNZ's database.
- A Blue Card means that a rider is stood down from all riding activities until clearance from a registered GP or registered medical specialist can be obtained.
- If a rider who has been issued with a Blue Card competes without first providing medical clearance, this may result in disciplinary action taken through the ESNZ disciplinary process set out in the ESNZ general regulations.
