2. All classes run under current ESNZ rules.
3. Formal attire unless directed by the judge.

8. **CLOSE OF ENTRIES:** Monday 17<sup>th</sup> September, thereafter **LATE**.
9. **LATE ENTRIES:** \$20 late fee for horses not entered in show. Will start first in the class where class is drawn according to ESNZ rules.
10. **PAYMENT:** Payment is with entry by POLI pay or credit card on Equestrian Entries at the time of finalising entry. Please direct any questions to the Show Secretary. Direct credit payments for non-finalised entries must be received by Tuesday 18<sup>th</sup> September or entries are **LATE**.
11. **SCRATCHINGS:** no refund on admin fee or late entry fee, class and all other fees including stabling (excluding premium covered yards) are refunded in full up until Thursday 20<sup>th</sup> Sept. Contact Angela at [sharples@farmside.co.nz](mailto:sharples@farmside.co.nz). No refunds for scratching or unused yards without a vet or medical certificate after this time. Class changes and late entries allowed.

## LEVIES & FEES

12. **ESNZ JUMPING LEVY:** \$5 per equine for the show (compulsory).
13. **ESNZ CASUAL JUMPING LEVY:** \$20 per equine per show. Required for horses not currently registered with ESNZ for Jumping/ Show Hunter. May not compete in any series class or at heights above 1:10m for horses and 1:00m for ponies. **NOTE:** the rider **must** be a full member of ESNZ.
14. **INTRODUCTORY CLASSES:** May be ridden by riders with an Introductory Membership or with a Casual Membership at \$10 per day.
15. **SHOW LEVY:** \$20 per horse.
16. **NEC FACILITIES FEE:** \$20 per horse.
17. **YARDING:** Open yards - \$20 per horse for the show; Covered yards/Stable block - \$50 per horse for the show. Paddocks - \$30 per horse for the show (minimum 2 horses per paddock). Premium covered stables \$140 per horse for the show. Initially all competitors requiring a stable, covered yard or open yard will be booking an open yard only & requesting an upgrade to either a covered yard or stable. This upgrade is at the discretion of the show organisers. Anyone requesting a premium covered stable will be guaranteed this with their entry. There will be **no refunds on premium yards**. Please note on entry if you own lease yards and the number owned. **NOTE:** NEC Taupo H&S policy specifically states that horses must not be left unattended whilst tied up to trucks or floats at any time. Accordingly, a row of day yards will be allocated for the use of riders who are not staying on the grounds and who have not therefore booked yards.
18. **CAMPING:** \$20 per truck - no power. Powered site additional \$10 per connection (limited availability).

## OTHER

19. Practice rings \$5 per round. Not judged.
20. There will be food available on the grounds.
21. The Organising Committee reserves the right to alter the programme and prize money. Riders will be advised about any changes via email so please ensure your contact details are up to date.

33. It is compulsory for all horses to wear a three digit horse ID number as per FEI Jumping rules Article 282 for the horse inspection and when competing. (A three digit ID number must be allocated by the organising committee of the event)
34. Please read these carefully and take note that you and your horse do not have to be FEI registered, but you must be registered with ESNZ and have your **ID papers** complete and **with you at the horse inspection**

# HEALTH & SAFETY POLICY

Carlene Reid Bayleys Taupo Spring Show is committed to providing and maintaining a safe and healthy event for all staff, and to providing the information, training and supervision needed to achieve this. We will take all practicable steps by:

- Providing a safe event, safe equipment and proper materials
- Identifying and monitoring hazards and using the hazard management hierarchy of *eliminate, isolate or minimise*
- Insisting upon establishment of safe methods and best practices
- Complying with all H&S legislation, regulations, and codes of practice. **NOTE:** NEC H&S policy specifically states that horses must not be left unattended whilst tied up to trucks or floats at any time. Accordingly, a row of day yards will be allocated for the use of riders who are not staying on the grounds and who have not therefore booked yards.

We will take responsibility for health and safety procedures, however, **ALL PEOPLE ON THIS SITE** need to be aware of their responsibilities and comply with the event's health and safety policy.

**COMPETITORS will be responsible for themselves at ALL times by observing safe practices and rules/instructions relating to their competition.**

Carlene Reid Bayleys Taupo Spring Show complies with the ESNZ concussion policy. Riders who have a suspected concussion will be **removed from the event**. Riders who are concussed are often unaware of their symptoms and may want to continue riding. The Ground Jury at the event takes responsibility for the rider's wellbeing, assesses the rider and make an informed choice about whether the rider should continue to ride or not – if any doubt the rider must be removed from the event as per the **Blue Card process** (outlined below).

**EVERY PERSON** involved in Rotorua Spring Show is encouraged to play a vital and responsible role in maintaining a safe and healthy event through:

- Being involved in the event health and safety system.
- Following correct procedures.
- Safe and proper use of equipment.
- Wearing protective clothing and equipment as and when required.
- Reporting any pain or discomfort as soon as possible.
- **Ensuring all accidents and incidents are reported.**
- Help new employees, trainees and visitors to understand the right safety procedures and why they exist.
- **Informing the office immediately of any health and safety concerns.**
- Keeping the event facilities tidy to minimise the risk of any trips and falls.

## **Blue Card process:**

ESNZ's Blue Card process has been developed to keep riders safe and to support officials in their duty of care:

- Officials can exclude a rider from participating in a competition or entire event by issuing a Blue Card because the rider has received a serious injury, including concussion or suspected concussion
- If a rider issued with a Blue Card at an event refuses to withdraw from the event, this may result in disciplinary action taken through the disciplinary process set out in the ESNZ general regulations
- The Blue Card notice is logged on a rider's profile on ESNZ's database
- A Blue Card means that a rider is stood down from all riding activities until clearance from a registered GP or registered medical specialist can be obtained
- If a rider who has been issued with a Blue Card competes without first providing medical clearance, this may result in disciplinary action taken through the ESNZ disciplinary process set out in the ESNZ general regulations.
