### Professor Natalie (Nat) Waran BSc (Hons), PhD (Cantab)

Natalie (Nat) is an internationally recognised equine behaviour and welfare scientist. She was Professor of Animal Welfare, International Animal Welfare Centre Director and International Dean at Edinburgh University's Veterinary School, before she moved back to NZ in 2016 to take up the role of Professor of One Welfare and Executive Dean at EIT/Te Pūkenga. Over the past 30+ years, she has researched and published across a range of areas including; horse transport, indicators of equine stress and pain, equine problem behaviour and equine quality of life and welfare assessment. She was a member of the UK research team considering the impact of heat and humidity on event horses, before the Atlanta 1996 Olympics and has provided independent expert welfare advice to a number of equine industries including the UK and HK Jockey Club. Her most recent research funded through the Hong Kong Jockey Club's new Welfare Foundation, and in collaboration with an international team is to develop methods for assessing positive emotion in horses. She has been a trustee for a number of international equine charities such as The Brooke and International Fund for Animal Welfare, and worked closely with others such as World Horse Welfare. A co-founder of the International Society for Equitation Science (ISES), she is now Honorary Fellow and Trustee for the organisation. In 2024 she will chair the local organising committee for the ISES conference to be held in NZ with the theme of 'A Good Life for all Horses'. She is also the Board Chair for Companion Animals New Zealand, the national organisation responsible for the NZ Animal Register – a microchip-based identification and traceability database for all companion animals (including horses) in NZ. As the invited chairperson of the new FEI Equine Ethics and Wellbeing Commission, she has just returned from Switzerland where she presented the FEI Sports Forum with a proposed new 'Good Life' Vision, Charter and 30 Recommendations to ensure equine welfare in sport is prioritised and to maintain equestrian sport's social licence. When at home in Hawkes Bay, Nat enjoys coaching riders, as well as training and riding her own horses.

# Judge's Officer Report Sue Whiddett

## Highlights of 2022 - 23 Season

## 1. Judges Clinics

Three judges refresher clinics were planned to be held as follows:

Palmerston Nth 20 August 2022 Online via Zoom 28/29 August 2022 Christchurch 3 September 2022

Gail Goodwin facilitated the Palmerston Nth clinic held at the home of Louise Ilton, one of our Pre-Candidate judges. This was attended by two National judges and three Pre-Candidate's who are interested in continuing the pathway to judging. The Christchurch clinic was facilitated by Lucy Malley at her property and was attended by four National judges.

Again this season there was a positive response to delivering a clinic via zoom and due to large numbers wishing to join online it was decided to hold two sessions. These were facilitated by Leigh Taylor with the support of other judges Advisors. Invitations were sent out to those in the South Island who hadn't been able to attend the 'in person' clinic and to Pre-Candidate judges who had either previously attended a clinic or had recently begun the process under mentorship of a National L3 judge. Twenty judges and two Pre-Candidate's joined these sessions.

Our judges clinics provide a forum for open discussion, to clarify queries, and are a valuable opportunity to talk through various scenarios that have arisen through the season.

Following our recent Judges Advisors meeting held Sunday 22 May, dates and venues for this years Judges clinics were discussed. All judges have been notified via email. The clinics will be held in person, in 4 areas.

# Auckland Area Delegates Report Lynette Jackson

### 2023

This season Auckland Show Hunter ran the North Island Champs in conjunction with Auckland Jumping in November. We ran the Show Hunter programme one week after the North Island Jumping Championship. The lovely Franklin A&P Showgrounds are not big enough to accommodate both Jumping and Show Hunter, so we elected to run over consecutive weekends.

Unfortunately, both weekends were hit with heavy rain. The Jumping committee did their best to repair the grounds following the jumping weekend with the use of heavy rollers. We were able to provide a good jumping surface on the first day of competition, but a heavy deluge overnight meant our grounds were sodden on the Sunday when the North Island Championship classes were scheduled. Rain throughout the day resulted in further deterioration of the grounds.

We had 104 horse and rider combinations entered, however we did have several competitors elect not to complete on the Sunday.

Our courses were aptly designed by Marilyn Vincent, who had a big task on her hands to position the course on the best jumping surface possible, given the conditions. We extended out the arenas and shifted the lines to better ground when required. Marilyn planned a technically challenging track for the Denise Crispe Memorial Special which was taken out by Rebecca Wylie and Larkspur Trinity.

Our event secretary Karyn Blake was kept very busy collating scores for the Tuakau Pony Club Teams Show Hunter Championship. Tuakau Pony Club #1 team took out the teams competition.

We were very lucky to secure Barfoot & Thompson Rural and Lifestyle Pukekohe as our overall show sponsor. Our committee would like to say a huge 'thank you' our generous sponsors and everyone who chipped in to help the show run smoothly. We would have been lost without Catherine from Site Land Development who was on hand to roll arenas and tow trucks into and out of the grounds. As well as being a valued sponsor, Catherine was there to help set up and do whatever was necessary.

After completing a big revamp of our jumps last season our committee were keen to get our gear back under cover to keep everything protected. We were very pleased to secure a couple of bays in the storage shed at the A&P grounds.

# Gisborne Area Delegates Report Kirsty MacLean

### 2023

The 2022/2023 season was another successful but at times challenging for the Gisborne Area. We are a small but dedicated committee and are very well supported by our local volunteers and sponsors. Caroline Coop has done a fantastic job in her first year as chairperson.

Our area is responsible for the running of two shows, we organise the show jumping and show hunter at the Poverty Bay A&P and then our main show in January the Larsen Sawmilling Championships. Like many areas this year the weather added an extra level of frustration and work, particularly at the A&P show. After the first day of jumping the decision was made to move the show jumping. Ring 1 was moved to the indoor arena and ring 2 to one of the other paddocks on the show grounds. We were incredibly lucky to have such amazing people packing up two arenas of jumps and moving them and rebuilding. Thank you to all involved in particular the course builders Kevin Hansen and Edward Bullock. This year would be one of the first we haven't had to irrigate before our January show, despite small entries there was some great jumping and if was nice to welcome the Australian Young Rider team back to NZ. The Gisborne area are very fortunate to have great assistance from local sponsors, officials and volunteers that make our shows run so well. We have fabulous grounds and yarding that are well maintained by our volunteers.

Leading up to the season we managed to run 2 training days, down from our usual 4 or 5 due to the wet conditions. These days offer a chance to jump a show jumping and/or show hunter course in a low-pressure environment. They don't require a huge number of resources and are a good money earner. To participate in the training days riders must be members of the Gisborne Area Equestrian and they must commit to helping for half a day at both shows. Members can also hire our practice arenas where we have a course of jumps set up. This has been a fantastic initiative and has given us a huge database of names to call upon as volunteers.

We had many quality applicants for the star spotter scholarship this year, Bre Collier was our lucky winner. Bre has been out and about with her pony and is always smiling. It has been very rewarding to see not only Bre but her wider whanau get involved with the Equestrian community. They are always there volunteering, always friendly and smiling, it's a pleasure to see.

Every year our group runs a show jumping and show hunter series across our two shows, local sports days and Wairoa A&P and Jumping show. #### 2023

The Taranaki Area successfully ran 4 days of series points over 3 shows, for the 2022-23 season, despite this being another challenging season for the running of equestrian events. These shows were all part of the regions' local A&P shows, namely Waverley, Egmont and Stratford.

Waverley Show held it's 100<sup>th</sup> show. The show hunter riders were privileged to ride in the main oval. ### A season of challenges!

Having worked through the issues thrown up by the previous season 2021/2022, which was disrupted by Covid restrictions, the 2022/23 season also set us challenges due to the Auckland floods and Cyclone Gabrielle. Our hard-working committee remained positive, working together to re-organise our February show at short notice.

Season Highlights Winter Series 2022

We ran a successful winter series, sponsored by Lani Allard Real Estate, which saw many newcomers entered over the three series days.

### Summer Series 2022/23

Our 5/6 November show saw our Category A classes well supported and our Rising Star classes (for horses not jumping over 90cm over the show) also continued to be popular with good entries.

We ran a Teams Challenge with a maximum 3 riders per team, made up of at least one pony and one horse, giving some flexibility for the make-up of each team. Fibre Fresh feed vouchers were awarded to members of the winning team. Our February 2023 show, scheduled for 18/19th was held on 4/5 March. This was down to local damage - SH16 was closed in places post the cyclone and our venue, Woodhill Sands also had a fairly extensive clean up due to trees down, debris, and sand being swept away. Entries were lower than we had anticipated, possibly due to HOY having to be cancelled and the extreme weather event which impacted many of our local riders. ESNZ announced that points gained at this show would be qualifying points for HOY 2024 which was fantastic. Again our Rising Star classes 85-90cm attracted the greatest number of entries. The four Introductory Horse classes followed Saturday's Open classes and proved a popular series over the two shows with the winner receiving a lovely rug sponsored by Burger King.

Our application to Four Winds Foundation was successful and this grant covered the costs of providing a medic for both of our summer shows.
