General:

- Facebook page – noted that this has been a great start to the communication. Please tell anyone who isn't on it so we can get as many SI riders as possible. There is also the NI riders rep page – you can be a member of both. I do post on both but there are other discussions on there that could be beneficial.
- Noted Pony riders being treated equally as hack riders. Small error on the wording at a comp with champions getting rugs. Committee has noted this.
- Support for Young Riders and how can we help them – Please send any ideas to Jude Nickolls jude.nickolls@gmail.com or FB message. Discussion on buddy system – needs to be pushed more proactively at area level. Maybe make a junior challenge or equivalent at events? Need more help from volunteers – maybe parents or involve the older 'young' riders. Cross discipline volunteering can be encouraged also.
- New Test Discussion – Jude explained that there was a meeting with top trainers and judges and both riders reps (so all in all very strong personalities) and we have all put a proposal to

the board that all members of this sub committee agreed on. We came up with a great system that will encourage riders and work well with judges for all levels from Level 1 to level 9. The proposal will be in front of the board at their meeting on Wednesday 30th January and then it will go out to areas. It was also discussed re everything being available online or having the option of buying pads and books from DNZ. The cost of any licence needs to be discussed with USDF to see which way is most cost efficient. It was a general feeling from OC's that Pads would be great to have the option and that riders would like to keep the books.

WHAT IS A REMIT?

TO REFER (A MATTER) TO A COMMITTEE OR AUTHORITY FOR DECISION

HOW DO REMITS WORK?

STEP ONE

Area Groups and ESNZ current individual full members can submit remits (changes to current rules, new rules or to remove rules) to Dressage NZ using a remit form. Remits must be seconded

STEP TWO

All remits are then made available to Area Groups to discuss at their meetings.

Each Area Group will then decide on how they would like for their Area Delegate to vote at the Dressage Planning Forum.

Remits passed at this meeting (maybe reworded for better definition or clarity) then go back to Areas and come forward for a final vote at the AGM

STEP THREE

Remits passed at the Planning Forum are then discussed at Dressage NZ AGM, and all voting delegates are able to vote for each remit submitted.

STEP FOUR

Any change to By-law 17 (Rules for Administration of Dressage) must also be approved by the ESNZ Board at their first meeting following the Dressage AGM
