**PAYMENT:** Payment must be made at time of entry via Poli (internet banking) or entry will not confirm.

**LATE ENTRIES:** If late entries are accepted they will incur a 50% fee on class entry fee.

SCRATCHINGS: No refund for scratchings made after Sunday 10th December.

Non-refundable admin fee \$20 per rider will be retained on acceptance of entry.

**CLASS CHANGES:** No additional class change fee

**REFUNDS:** Refunds will be paid electronically following the completion of the show, to the bank account

nominated in your Evo Events account. Refunds of less than \$10 will not be paid.

**PRIZE MONEY:** All advertised prize money will be paid and if required additional prize money will be paid on a 1:7

ratio of starters. Prize money will be paid electronically to the person who made the entry.

#### Conditions:

All riders, horses and ponies must compete with the appropriate ESNZ membership

All classes are run under ESNZ rules, with the exception of the World Cup and CSI\* which will run under FEI rules

Formal attire in all competition rings All rings will run in draw order

All fees and prize money are inclusive of GST

· All series classes are run under the relevant ESNZ Jumping Series conditions

The Organising Committee reserves the right to alter the programme and prize money.

Parents are responsible for children under the age of 18 at all times

All competitors enter at their own risk and abide by the Health & Safety Act and the National Equestrian Centre's Health and Safety Policy.

#### **Great Lake Challenge:**

The first round on Friday will be run under Article 238.2.1. Approximately the top 40 combinations, and at least all clear rounds, will go forward to the second round, run on Saturday under Article 238.2.2. Penalties will not be carried forward. The draw for the final will be reverse placing order from the Qualifier. Class is restricted to horses only competing in 1.30m or less for the duration of the show.

#### **FEI Classes:**

Classes 25 and 26 will be run under FEI rules. There will be a trot up for these classes on Saturday morning, (time to be confirmed). Competitors in class 30 must produce their horses FEI Passport/Recognition Card at the trot up. Horse and Riders must be FEI Registered to compete in these classes. Horses may only compete in one of these classes at the show.

#### **World Cup Class Conditions:**

As per World Cup rules, to qualify for the World Cup class horse and rider must complete a full round in either of the following classes: Class 6: Welcome Horse 1.40 or Class 13: Horse 1.40. Horses failing to complete one of these classes will be ineligible to compete in the World Cup Class however they may enter another class at no cost. All horses are required to stay on the grounds until competition of competition.

Trot up: The trot up for horses competing in FEI classes (World Cup and 1\*) will be held on Saturday morning – time to be advised.

#### Dogs:

Dogs are welcome at the NEC but must be on a leash at all times, 24 hours per day. No dogs on the indoor surface at any time.



## **Health and Safety Policy**

The Taupo Christmas Classic and the National Equestrian Centre is committed to providing and maintaining a safe and healthy event for all staff, and to providing the information, training and supervision needed to achieve this.

We will take all practicable steps by;

- Providing a safe event, safe equipment and proper materials
- Identifying and monitoring hazards and using the hazard management hierarchy of eliminate, isolate or minimise.
- · Insist upon establishment of safe methods and best practices
- Comply with all H&S legislation, regulations and codes of practice

We will take responsibility for health and safety procedures, however, **ALL PEOPLE ON THIS SITE** need to be aware of their responsibilities and comply with the event's health and safety policy.

**COMPETITORS** will be responsible for themselves at ALL times by observing safe practices and rules/instructions relating to their competition.

Every person involved in the Taupo Christmas Classic is encouraged to play a vital and responsible role in maintaining a safe and healthy event through:

- Being involved in the event health and safety system.
- Following correct procedures.
- Safe and proper use of equipment.
- Keeping horses under proper supervision or suitably yarded at all times
- Wearing protective clothing and equipment as and when required.
- Reporting any pain or discomfort as soon as possible.
- Ensuring all accidents and incidents are reported.
- Help new employees, trainees and visitors to understand the right safety procedures and why they exist.
- Informing the office immediately of any health and safety concerns.
- Keeping the event facilities tidy to minimise the risk of any trips and falls.

## THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

- 1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
- 2. Horses and competitors must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
- 3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
- 4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
- 5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.
