Event Rules & Conditions

It is the obligation of the Rider or Persons Responsible to read and understand the conditions for this event and abide by those conditions, and those of the waiver and agreement on the Evo Events online entry system. All participants / attendees should note

In all equestrian sports the horse must be considered paramount. The well-being of the horse shall be above the demands of breeders, trainers, riders, owners, dealers, organisers, sponsors or officials.

Classes & Stabling Allocation

The OC reserves the right to restrict classes to maximum numbers in all classes to ensure the smooth running of the event. Stables and covered yards will be allocated with a preference given to SI travelling horses, Elementary Grade and higher and then by date of entry PAID. It is strongly recommended that riders with ponies and horses in Preliminary & Novice and also a higher-grade horse or pony enter and pay as soon as possible if horses need to be together in covered yards. This will be at the discretion of the OC/Stable Manager. No portable stables will be available.

Official Start Time: The official event start time is 7am Friday 26th January 2024. This is the start time for the period of jurisdiction for all Equestrian Sport New Zealand (ESNZ) General Regulations, Veterinary Regulations and ESNZ Dressage/Para Equestrian rules. All horses and ponies on the grounds after the official start time of the event must be entered at the event or have express permission from the Organising Committee to be on site and will be subject to ground levy and yards fees. Please note Dressage NZ/Para Equestrian rules do not allow the use of prohibited gear from time of arrival on the grounds.



Official finish time: The official finish time will be sixty minutes after the completion of the last class or 60 minutes after the completion of all presentations for the event whichever is the later.

Protests & Complaints: Protests and complaints may be considered by the Ground Jury at an event in accordance with Art 137 of the ESNZ General Regulations. As a guideline only, protests must be lodged within 60 minutes of the completion of the competition to which the protest relates, and a complaint within 60 minutes of the completion of the event. The Ground Jury is the sole judge of time in both cases. For compete rules and official documentation required, please refer to https://www.nzequestrian.org.nz/esnz/rules-regulations/

Tests: All tests from the Dressage NZ Test book 2023 or FEI website unless stated otherwise.

Competition Draw: Draw will be available by email and at www.evoevents.co.nz If required, a revised draw and/or start times for the following day's competition will be available each evening in the Riders Area in the Indoor. The OC reserves the right to alter the program to ensure the smooth running of the event. It is the rider's responsibility to check any new times posted.

Rider Briefing: Thursday 25th January 2024. 6.00 pm, in the Riders Area of the Indoor. All riders' attendance is strongly recommended.

Horse Identification, Yards & Accommodation

- 1. Horse/Pony ID Numbers (DR Art 477): Approved Horse/Pony official identification numbers must be worn on both sides of the horse/pony at all times during warm up and competition, and when being ridden or led in arena familiarization. ID Tag with Horse Name, Rider phone contact must be worn in or out of the stable/yard at all other times.
- 2. Please keep wash down bays clean at all times. Washing of horses is limited to wash bays only
- 3. Moving horses to unallocated yards/paddocks is prohibited.
- 4. Please use the skips provided for horse waste not rubbish, bins are provided for rubbish.
- 5. Temporary yards are not permitted.
- 6. All yards/stables are to be left properly mucked out. Muck skips will be located near the yards.
- 7. ALL horses/ponies are allocated stables, paddocks or yards. Horses not staying overnight will only be allocated open yards.

Riders Assistance Dressage NZ welcomes your assistance and support. Riders and/or their families or supporters are requested to advise with entries tasks that can be helped with to ensure the smooth running of the event. By completing the Online Volunteer information and contributing to the event means you go into the draw to receive a full entry refund (not including stabling or camping). Please state at time of entry if you can assist with the following tasks, we will take account of riding times.

- · Writer for a class · Test sheet runner
- Managing manure indoor and Fiber arenas

· Provide Judges Vehicle

Eligibility of Riders, Horses, Ponies & Combinations: This event is classified as a Regional Event (RE) with the exception of the Pony (Medium level FEI Pony classes), Young Rider (FEI Small Tour Classes) and U25CH (FEI Grand Prix Classes) which are classified National Championships (NCH) NCH classes are open to any grade of pony/horse.

Downgraded horses/ponies are eligible to compete in RE classes in their downgraded level but ONLY with the rider specified in the downgrade application. Note that points may only be earned in the AMS Performance League by combinations where riders are an ESNZ Child or Full member and the horse/pony has an Annual Dressage Start.

Ponies competing in pony specific classes may be asked to present height certificates if not available on the ESNZ database.

• Lead Rein Rider 8 years and under.

(Non-Graded classes) Rider must be an ESNZ Child Member, or pay ESNZ Casual Membership online with entries. Riders are eligible from the beginning of the calendar year in which they turn five (5)years until they reach the age of eight (8) years as at 26th January 2024.

Lead rein ponies must be 138cm or under. Grade of pony unrestricted and may be ESNZ registered or unregistered. Lead rein riders and ponies cannot be entered in any other section of the show

Lead rein riders are those as yet unable to ride without assistance from a leader or attendant in any discipline competition.

• Children Pony Rider 12 years and under.

(Non-Graded classes) Rider must be an ESNZ Child Member, or pay ESNZ Casual Membership online with entries. Riders age of twelve (12) years at the 26th January 2024 and under are eligible. May only compete on a pony 148cm or under. Grade of pony unrestricted and may be ESNZ registered or unregistered. Riders may not enter in graded classes but may enter Equitation Class.

• Pony Riders.

(Graded classes). Rider must be an ESNZ Child or Full Member. Riders are eligible from the beginning of the calendar year in which they turn five (5) until they reach the age of sixteen (16) years, but if a rider turned seventeen (17) years on or after 1 August 2023 they may compete in this section. Pony must be ESNZ registered, and have Annual Dressage Start or pay \$5 per class Dressage casual start fee with online entry. Exception - Ponies in the Pony Championship (FEI Pony Classes < Medium level) must have a Dressage Annual Start.

• Junior Riders.

(Non-Graded classes) Rider must be an ESNZ Child or Full Member or pay ESNZ Casual Membership online with entries. Riders thirteen (13)yrs as at 26 January 2024 until they reach the age of twenty-one years. If a rider turned 21 on or after 1 August 2023 they may compete in this section. May compte on a horse or a pony, which may be ESNZ registered or unregistered. Riders in this section may not compete in any graded class at the event. (Equitation classes are non-graded) Grade of horse/pony unrestricted and may be ESNZ registered or unregistered. If unregistered must pay ESNZ Horse Casual Registration fee online with entries

• Young Riders.

Rider must be an ESNZ Child or Full Member. Riders must be on horses except riders who exceed the pony rider age eligibility may compete on a pony in this section. Riders are eligible from the beginning of the calendar year in which they turn twelve (12) years until they reach the age of twenty-one (21). If a rider turned 21 on or after 1 August 2022, they may compete in this section. Horse/Pony be ESNZ registered and have Annual Dressage Start or pay Dressage casual start fee of \$5 per class up to Medium level or \$10 per class Adv Medium and above.

• Youth Riders.

Rider must be an ESNZ Child or Full Member. Riders must be on horses except riders who exceed the pony rider age eligibility may compete on a pony in this section. Riders are eligible from the beginning of the calendar year in which they turn twelve (12) years until they reach the age of twenty-five (25). If a rider turned 25 on or after 1 August 2023, they may compete in this section. Horse/Pony be ESNZ registered and have Annual Dressage Start or pay Dressage casual start fee of \$5 per class up to Medium level or \$10 per class Adv Medium and above.

Equal Placings

- 1. In the case of equality in any qualifying class, the higher collective marks will determine the higher placing
- 2. If the competitors are still equal then the higher co-efficient marks will determine the placings
- 3. If there is still an equality of points, the competitors are given the same placing
- 4. In Freestyle competitions the higher artistic marks will determine the higher placing. If there is still an equality of points, the competitors are given the same placing

Presentation of Prizes

- 1. There will be no prize money awarded at the event.
- 2. Rosettes will be awarded in all classes 1st to 4th place.
- 3. Rosettes will not be awarded to riders that do not attend scheduled prize giving. Presentation times will be advised in the program. No Rosettes will be posted after the event.

Championships Presentations & Points

- 1. Lead Rein 8 years and Under Champion & Reserve Sashes and Rug for Champion. 2.
- 12 years and Under Champion & Reserve Sashes and Rug for Champion.
- 3. Pony Champions Rug/Sash for Champions & Reserve Sash plus Hyland Trophy for FEI Level Pony National Champion.
- 4. Junior Rider 13 years to 21 years Champion & Reserve Sashes and Rug for Champion.
- 5. Young Rider/Youth (Combined): Rug/Sash for Champions & Reserve Sash (all grades) Waldebago Trophy Top Placed Young Rider in Small Tour and KH Arvan Trophy for Top Place Combined Youth/Young Rider in Grand Prix.
- 6. Classes marked Q in the schedule of classes will count for level championship.
- 7. Points will be awarded, 1st 20, 2nd 18, and so on down to 10th place.
- 8. In the event of a tie the highest average percentage wins.
- 9. Qualifying classes at Levels 7, 8 and 9 have a multiplier of 1.5 (1st = 30 points) This for the awarding of the Fissenden Trophy for most points in graded classes at the event where riders at this level only have one class per day.

Event Conditions

- 1. All competitions will be run under current ESNZ GR's, VR's & ESNZ Rules for ESNZ Dressage/Para Equestrian.
- 2. Riders in graded classes may not enter any non-graded class. Exceptions: Equitation classes & 12 yrs and under.
- 3. The OC reserves the right to alter the programme/schedule within the ESNZ GR's/ESNZ Dressage rules.
- 4. Horses/Ponies may only be entered for qualifiers for one Level of Championship
- 5. Registered horses and ponies ESNZ identification numbers must be worn at all times, including warmup. Non graded ponies will be issued a saddle blanket number which must be displayed on both sides of the horse/pony.
- 6. ID Tag with Horse Name, Rider phone contact must be worn in or out of the stable/yard at all other times. Any persons responsible must be on the grounds at all times, otherwise an alternative person responsible must be notified to the Office in penalty of elimination.
- 7. Stallions & Handlers/Owners/Persons Responsible must comply with ESNZ Article 147 and stallions must be housed in a stable at all times when not being ridden or hand-walked.

Rider Equitation Championships

These classes will be judged based on the riders' ability to influence the horse's way of going, effectiveness of the aids, accuracy, security of seat, balance and position. Open to any registered pony/horse and rider age 25 years and under.

Tests

- **Fledgling 12 years and under.** Test British Dressage Fledgling Rider Test 1 (2005) equivalent DNZ Preliminary. Riders twelve (12) years and under as at 26 January 2024.
- Junior 13 years 21 years. Test British Dressage C Squad Rider Test 1 (2010) equivalent DNZ Level Novice. Riders thirteen (13) years as at 26 January 2024 until they reach the age of twenty-one years. If a rider turned 21 on or after 1 August 2023 they may compete in this section.
- Intermediate Riders 25 years and under who have never earned grading points higher than Medium level at date of close of entries. Test British Dressage B Squad Rider Test 2 (2011 equivalent DNZ Elementary. Riders are eligible from the beginning of the calendar year in which they turn twelve (12) years until they reach the age of twenty-five (25). If a rider turned 25 on or after 1 August 2023, they may compete in this section.

Conditions

- 1. May compete on a horse or pony
- 2. Riders may compete on downgraded ponies/horses
- 3. Only one entry per rider
- 4. Only 20 entries will be taken in each level and in the case of excessive entries balloting may occur
- 5. Tests may not be commanded
- 6. Must be ridden in a snaffle bridle

Eligibility

- Riders must be ESNZ Child or full competitive members.

- 2. Participating horses and ponies must be ESNZ registered and have an annual dressage start .
- 3. Downgraded horses/ponies may only compete in their original grade (refer DG rules eff 1 1 September 2023).
- 4. Horses/Ponies may be entered in any level for which they are eligible as per the grading rules.
- 5. Riders who are not eligible to compete in any pony division may compete in the Young Rider or Youth section on a pony.
- 6. Riders may only enter one section on the same mount but can contest more than one level within that section. A rider 16 years or under may enter a horse in the horse division and a pony in the pony division.

Conditions

- 1. Riders must nominate which levels they wish to enter on www.evoevents.co.nz by 1 November 2023.
- 2. Combinations may contest more than one level at an event.
- 3. Riders may contest the league on more than one mount.
- 4. For Pony Riders scores to count from any class at a Kiwi Arena Rake Premier League event and the U25 CH/Youth Festival.
- 5. For Young Riders scores to count from any class at a Kiwi Arena Rake Premier League event and the U25 CH/Youth Festival
- 6. For Youth Riders scores to count from any class at a Kiwi Arena Rake Premier League event and the U25 CH/Youth Festival.

National Sections – you may only enter one section but can contest more than one level within that section.

Scoring

- 1. Points will be allocated from all graded classes at Premier League Events, and the NZ Youth Dressage Festival.
- 2. Maximum 10 best combination scores will count for the final league points.
- 3. Combinations competing in more than one level will have their top 10 scores across all levels carried forward for final points classification for determining the National winner. Eg if a combination scores 16 pts in Preliminary and 16 pts in Novice their total score of 32 will determine the national winner. The points will remain at 16 in each grade for the purpose of determining the level winner.
- 4. In the event of a tie at any level, the combination with the highest average percentage from the top ten scores will be deemed the winner.
- 5. In the event of a tie for the national awards the highest level will be deemed the winner.
- 6. League Points will be allocated as follows

Young Riders

- 1. Preliminary, Novice, Elementary, Medium, Advanced Medium, Advanced, Small Tour, Medium Tour, Grand Prix Winners Winners sash and \$100 AMS Saddlery Voucher for every level
- 2. National Winner The combination with the highest points wins a \$150 AMS Saddlery Voucher, Trophy and Sash.

Youth Riders

- 1. Preliminary to Small Tour combined and Medium Tour & Grand Prix combined winners Winners sash and \$100 AMS Saddlery Voucher for every level
- 2. National Winner The combination with the highest points wins a \$150 AMS Saddlery Voucher, Trophy and Sash.

Presentations

- 2. Award open to horses registered with the NZ Hanoverian Society
- 3. Winners must be Champion or Reserve Champion in their grade and must be nominated at time of entry.

- 2. No smoking/vaping in any buildings or in yard/stable areas
- 3. Neither the National Equestrian Centre, ESNZ, Dressage NZ, ESNZ Para Equestrian or nor any representative of these bodies, accepts any liability for any loss, damage, injury or illness to horse, pony, rider, spectators, land, vehicles or any personal property whether caused by their negligence or breach of contract in any way.
- 4. The National Equestrian Centre, ESNZ, Dressage NZ or ESNZ Para Equestrian shall not be liable for the safety of any goods/equipment or the loss of, or damage to such goods and equipment, brought in/stored at the venue, during the period of use.
- 5. Any damage to the National Equestrian Centre facilities to be reported immediately to the Event Office.

- 3. Dogs may be exercised on the cross country course only
- 4. Failure to adhere to these rulings will result in a complete dog ban for 2024
- 5. The dog must be on a lead at all times
- 6. The owner of the dog will be responsible for the cost of any damage/harm caused by the dog at the competition.

Camp Sites

- 1. Parking and camping areas may be defined.
- 2. Limited powered sites are available in the truck park.
- 3. Any persons found plugging their truck/float/camper into power sockets in the ablution block or other illegal connection will be asked to leave the venue
- 4. Please be tidy and use bins for all rubbish

Vehicles & Motorbikes - including bicycles, ebikes and scooters

- 1. Speed limit for all vehicles 15 kph.

Professional Services

- 1. Equine Therapists and Treatment
- a. Any equine therapists or practitioners who are not veterinarian and intend to provide therapeutic treatment to equines in any capacity at this event in a private or commercial basis must notify the Organising Committee of any treatment prior to the event.
- b. All practitioners must also comply with the Conditions applicable to this event set out in the Schedule of classes.
- c. Riders who own their equipment (eg Equissage, Cyclossage or similar) are only permitted to treat their own horses with these systems at the event.
- d. Any practitioner receiving financial or other gain from providing therapies at the event will be required to pay a trade exhibitor fee at the discretion of the Organising Committee.
- 2. Other Professionals including freelance grooms
 - a. Any other professional intending on providing services at this event must obtain prior agreement from the Organising Committee this excludes professionals Dressage Coaches assisting in the warmup of competitors and grooms that are in part or full time employment of a competitor.

- 1. This event is run under the ESNZ Para-Equestrian Rules 2022 and the DNZ rules where applicable
- 2. All riders must be current, full or Child members of ESNZ at time of entry.
- 3. All horses must be registered with ESNZ.
- 4. No prior qualification applies; however all P-E riders must have a current FEI or ESNZ ID card, a copy of which must be included with entries and to be carried while riding.
- 5. Riders must wear the orange P-E ID discs on both sides of their saddle blankets at all times while mounted.
- 6. A horse may not be shared by different riders between P-E & AB classes.
- 7. A horse may be shared by riders of different Grades in Para classes as per Article 125.
- 8. While every effort will be made to accommodate riders wishing to compete in both P-E & AB classes and to accommodate P-E riders with more than one horse, the smooth running of the event is paramount and should there be excessive entries or timetabling issues, then riders may be asked to nominate which horse/discipline they want to compete in.
- 9. The draw will be available at www.evoevents.co.nz
- 10. All classes will be eligible for para grading points.
- 11. There will be one overall Champion. The rider who achieves the highest combined percentages in any grade, over all tests will be the 2024 Para-Equestrian Youth Rider Champion.

- 2. Teams consist of four riders. At least three of the horses must compete in different grades.
- 3. All team riders must be full members of ESNZ and be competing in graded competitions
- 4. One rider may only compete on one horse, unless an area only has three riders, in which case one rider may compete on two horses.
- 5. All horses and riders in each team must be from the same area, except that, if an area has insufficient riders competing at the Championships, up to two volunteer combinations from another area may be used provided they are not already in a team.
- 6. The Opposite Island may compete as an island team if it doesn't have enough competitors to make an area team. (exception NI vs SI Team Challenge).
- 7. Graded Championship Classes marked Q will count for teams event points
- 8. Points allocated are 10 for 1st, 9 for 2nd down to 1 for 10th. Lower placings don't score.
- 9. In the event of a tie, the combined points of the two highest placed horses in each team will count
- 10. Teams entries must be submitted at the event office by 5pm 25th January 2024.
- 11. Teams must be nominated by area groups and entry form signed by one area official.
- 12. An area may enter more than one team.
- 13. Combinations may only compete for one team.
- 14. In the event of a team member scratching from the event a substitute horse and rider may be included in the team.
